## **1DISTRICT ATTORNEYS**

## AN ACT

CONCERNING REDUCING THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION FOR PROSECUTION TRAINING.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

**SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 20-1-111, **amend** (4)(b) as follows:

- **20-1-111. District attorneys may cooperate or contract contents appropriation repeal.** (4) (b) (I) The general assembly shall annually appropriate three hundred fifty thousand dollars to the department of law for allocation to the Colorado district attorneys' council, the statewide organization representing district attorneys, or its successor, for the public purpose of providing prosecution training, seminars, continuing education programs, and other prosecution-related services on behalf of the district attorneys who are members of the organization, including, but not limited to, costs and expenses for personnel, administration, materials, and travel.
- (II) (A) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (4)(b)(I) of this section, for the 2020-21 state fiscal year, the general assembly shall appropriate two hundred thousand dollars for the purposes described in subsection (4)(b)(I) of this section.
  - (B) This subsection (4)(b)(II) is repealed, effective July 1, 2021.
- **SECTION 2.** Appropriation adjustments to 2020 long bill. To implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual general appropriation act for the 2020-21 state fiscal year to the department of law for deputy district attorney training is decreased by \$150,000.

**SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
