CONCERNING FUNDING FOR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION INFORMATION
TECHNOLOGY, AND MAKING SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS IN
CONNECTION THEREWITH.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Capital construction information technology appropriations for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2025. In Session Laws of Colorado 2025, **amend** section 4 of chapter 476, (SB 25- 206), as follows:

Section 4. Capital Construction Information Technology Appropriation.
