Summary Information

Overview. The bill postpones the expiration of all state department rules adopted or amended between November 1, 2024 and November 1, 2025.

Types of impacts. The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

Summary of Legislation

The bill allows all state agency, Public Employees' Retirement Association, and State Board of Equalization rules to continue that were adopted or amended between November 1, 2024, and November 1, 2025.

State Expenditures

By not requiring any state agency or political subdivision to adopt new rules to replace those set to expire, the bill minimally decreases workload for these entities. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
