A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE REPEAL OF CERTAIN BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**
102 **RESOURCES ADMINISTERED BY THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH**
103 **ADMINISTRATION, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REDUCING**
104 **AN APPROPRIATION.**

Bill Summary

organization serving agricultural and rural communities in Colorado to provide vouchers for behavioral health care services;

- Repeals the requirement that the BHA contract with an independent third party to provide services and supports to behavioral health providers seeking to become behavioral health safety net providers;
- Repeals the building substance use disorder treatment capacity in underserved communities grant program;
- Repeals the recovery support services grant program;
- Transfers the balance of the high-risk families cash fund (fund) to the general fund and repeals the fund on July 1, 2026; and
- Reduces appropriations to the department of education for the affected programs and services.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **repeal** 27-50-305,
3 27-60-110, 27-80-120, and 27-80-126.

4 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-50-101, **amend**
5 (6); and **add** (17.5) as follows:

6 **27-50-101. Definitions.**

7 As used in this article 50, unless the context otherwise requires:

8 (6) "Behavioral health provider" means a recovery community
9 organization, ~~as defined in section 27-80-126~~, a recovery support services
10 organization, as defined in section 27-60-108, or a licensed organization
11 or professional providing diagnostic, therapeutic, or psychological
12 services for behavioral health conditions. Behavioral health providers
13 include a residential child care facility, as defined in section 26-6-903
14 (29), and a federally qualified health center.

15 (17.5) "RECOVERY COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION" MEANS AN
16 INDEPENDENT, NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION LED AND GOVERNED BY
17 REPRESENTATIVES OF LOCAL COMMUNITIES OF RECOVERY THAT ORGANIZE

1 RECOVERY-FOCUSED POLICY ADVOCACY ACTIVITIES, CARRY OUT
2 RECOVERY-FOCUSED COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND OUTREACH PROGRAMS,
3 OR PROVIDE PEER-RUN RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES.

4 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-50-105, **amend**
5 (1)(gg); and **repeal** (1)(h), (1)(ee), and (1)(ii) as follows:

6 **27-50-105. Administration of behavioral health programs -**
7 **state plan - sole mental health authority - gifts, grants, or donations**
8 **- repeal.**

9 (1) The BHA shall administer and provide the following
10 behavioral health programs and services:

11 (h) Behavioral health-care services for rural and agricultural
12 communities pursuant to section 27-60-110;

24 **SECTION 4.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-60-301, **amend**
25 (3) as follows:

26 **27-60-301. Definitions.**

27 As used in this part 3, unless the context otherwise requires:

1 (3) "Behavioral health provider" means a recovery community
2 organization, as defined in ~~section 27-80-126~~ SECTION 27-50-101, a
3 recovery support services organization, as defined in section 27-60-108,
4 or a licensed organization or professional that provides diagnostic,
5 therapeutic, or psychological services for behavioral health conditions.
6 Behavioral health providers include a residential child care facility, as
7 defined in section 26-6-903 (29), and a federally qualified health center,
8 as defined in the federal "Social Security Act", 42 U.S.C. sec. 1395x
9 (aa)(4).

10 **SECTION 5.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 27-80-123, **add** (8)
11 and (9) as follows:

12 **27-80-123. High-risk families cash fund - creation - services**
13 **provided - report - definition - repeal.**

14 (8) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL TRANSFER ALL UNEXPENDED
15 AND UNENCUMBERED MONEY IN THE FUND ON JUNE 30, 2026, TO THE
16 GENERAL FUND.

17 (9) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026.

18 **SECTION 6. Appropriation - adjustments to 2026 long bill.**

19 (1) Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, to implement this
20 act, the appropriations made in the annual general appropriation act for
21 the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the department of human services for use
22 by the behavioral health administration for behavioral health safety net
23 services is decreased by \$3,500,000, which amount consists of \$500,000
24 from the general fund and \$3,000,000 from the marijuana tax cash fund
25 created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S.

26 (2) Subsection (1) of this section does not require a reduction of
27 an appropriation in the annual general appropriation act for the 2026-27

1 state fiscal year if:

2 (a) The general fund appropriation made in the annual general
3 appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the department of
4 human services for use by the behavioral health administration for
5 behavioral health safety net services is less than the amount of the
6 adjustment required in subsection (1) of this section;

7 (b) The cash funds appropriation from the marijuana tax cash fund
8 created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S., made in the annual general
9 appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the department of
10 human services for use by the behavioral health administration for
11 behavioral health safety net services is less than the amount of the
12 adjustment required in subsection (1) of this section; or

13 (c) The annual general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state
14 fiscal year does not include an appropriation to the department of human
15 services for use by the behavioral health administration for behavioral
16 health safety net services.

17 (3) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this section, to
18 implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual
19 general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the
20 department of human services for use by the behavioral health
21 administration for the recovery support services grant program is
22 decreased by \$1,600,805, and the related FTE is decreased by 1.0 FTE.

23 (4) (a) If the general fund appropriation made in the annual
24 general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the
25 department of human services for use by the behavioral health
26 administration for the recovery support services grant program is an
27 amount less than the amount of the adjustment required in subsection (3)

1 of this section, the general fund appropriation is decreased to \$0.

2 (b) If the annual general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state
3 fiscal year does not include an appropriation to the department of human
4 services for use by the behavioral health administration for the recovery
5 support services grant program, then subsection (3) of this section does
6 not require a reduction of an appropriation in the annual general
7 appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year.

8 (5) Except as provided in subsection (6) of this section, to
9 implement this act, the general fund appropriation made in the annual
10 general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the
11 department of human services for use by the behavioral health
12 administration for behavioral health vouchers is decreased by \$50,000.

13 (6) (a) If the general fund appropriation made in the annual
14 general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year to the
15 department of human services for use by the behavioral health
16 administration for behavioral health vouchers is an amount less than the
17 amount of the adjustment required in subsection (5) of this section, the
18 general fund appropriation is decreased to \$0.

19 (b) If the annual general appropriation act for the 2026-27 state
20 fiscal year does not include an appropriation to the department of human
21 services for use by the behavioral health administration for behavioral
22 health vouchers, then subsection (5) of this section does not require a
23 reduction of an appropriation in the annual general appropriation act for
24 the 2026-27 state fiscal year.

26 **SECTION 7. Effective date.** This act takes effect upon passage;
27 except that section 6 of this act takes effect only if the annual general

1 appropriation act for the 2026-27 state fiscal year becomes law, in which
2 case section 6 takes effect upon the effective date of this act or of the
3 annual general appropriation act for state fiscal year 2026-27, whichever
4 is later.

5 **SECTION 8. Safety clause.** The general assembly finds,
6 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
7 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety or for appropriations for
8 the support and maintenance of the departments of the state and state
9 institutions.
