## **Fiscal Assessment of L.001 to HB26-1343**

This memorandum is an assessment of the fiscal impact of the attached proposed amendment L.001 to House Bill 26-1343. This fiscal assessment is for the impact of the bill with inclusion of this amendment only. Any other added amendment could influence the fiscal impact.

### **Summary of Proposed Amendment**

---

The amendment removes the requirement that competency evaluations be accepted and filed electronically.

### **Fiscal Impact of Amendment**

---

By removing this requirement, the bill eliminates the \$26,296 cash fund expenditure shown in the initial published fiscal note for the Judicial Department to expand electronic submission capabilities of their e-filing platforms to allow filings from non-attorney professionals.

### **Bill's Revised Fiscal Impact with Amendment**

---

With Amendment L.001, no appropriation is required. To the extent the remaining electronic submission of materials during administrative adjudicatory hearings streamline work for administrative law judges and state parties involved in hearings, workload will decrease. Any decrease is assumed to be minimal.
