### Summary Information

**Overview.** The bill requires that child care centers disclose certain information to parents and guardians regarding child care workers mandatory reporting of child abuse and policies for use of video recording equipment and the associated footage.

**Types of impacts.** The bill is projected to affect the following areas on an ongoing basis:

- Minimal State Workload
- Local Government

**Appropriations.** No appropriation is required.

## Summary of Legislation

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The bill requires that child care centers disclose the following information in its policies and procedures to the parents or guardians of enrolled children:

- a statement that child care center workers are mandatory reporters of child abuse and neglect; and
- a statement disclosing policies related to the use of video recording equipment and associated video footage, including the use, retention, and disposal of recordings, privacy protections, and parental and legal access to video footage.

## State and Local Governments

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The bill increases workload for state and local government entities that operate child care facilities, including institutions of higher education and local recreation centers, to update policies and disclose them to parents and guardians. In addition, the bill may minimally increase workload in the Department of Early Childhood to communicate the requirements to child care centers and to monitor compliance as part of its licensing process. No change in state appropriations is required.

## Effective Date

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The bill was signed into law by the Governor on April 6, 2026, and takes effect on August 12, 2026, assuming no referendum petition is filed
