the Department of Higher Education shall transfer the amount approved, up to \$68,281,957, to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing FY 2018-19 pursuant to Section 23-18-304(1)(c), C.R.S. If permission is discontinued, or is granted for a lesser amount, the Department of Higher Education shall transfer any portion of the \$68,281,957 that is not transferred to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to the Regents of the University of Colorado.

SECTION 3. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017. (1) For the 2017-18 state fiscal year, \$26,943,875 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of section 2 of chapter 421 (SB 17-254), Session Laws of Colorado 2017, as follows:

(a) \$17,847,003 from the general fund for medical services premiums;

(b) \$444,003 from the general fund for behavioral health capitation payments;

(c) \$1,265,019 for the children's basic health plan medical and dental costs, which consists of \$523,427 from the children's basic health plan trust fund created in section 25.5-8-105 (1), C.R.S., and \$741,592 from recoveries and recoupments; and

(d) \$7,387,850 for mental health institutes, which consists of \$3,694,541 from the general fund and \$3,693,309 from federal funds.

(2) In accordance with section 24-75-109 (4)(a), C.R.S., all restrictions on funds for the department of health care policy and financing for the 2018-19 state fiscal year for the amounts and items of appropriation listed in this section are released.
