- 22 Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, Grand Totals; Department of Higher Education, College Opportunity Fund Program, Fee-for-service Contracts with State Institutions, Fee-for-service Contracts with State Institutions for Specialty Education Programs; and Governing Boards, Regents of the University of Colorado -- The Department of Higher Education shall transfer \$821,060 to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing for administrative costs and family medicine residency placements associated with care provided by the faculty of the health sciences center campus at the University of Colorado that are eligible for payment pursuant to Section 25.5-4-401, C.R.S. If the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid services continues to allow the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to make supplemental payments to the University of Colorado School of Medicine, the Department of Higher Education shall transfer the amount approved, up to \$77,998,160, to the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing pursuant to Section 23-18-304(1)(c), C.R.S. SECTION 2. Appropriation to the department of higher education for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019. In Session Laws of Colorado 2019, add a new appropriation as section 3 to chapter 162, (HB 19-1196), as follows:

Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2019-20 state fiscal year, \$212,804 is appropriated to the department of higher education for use by the Colorado commission on higher education. This appropriation is from reappropriated funds received from the governing boards of higher education institutions and is based on an assumption that the commission will require an additional 0.2 FTE. To implement this act, the commission may use this appropriation for a financial aid assessment tool. If not expended prior to July 1, 2020, \$200,000 appropriated in this section is further appropriated to the department for the 2020-21 state fiscal year for the same purpose.

SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds, determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
