CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF  
NATURAL RESOURCES.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

**SECTION 1.** **Appropriation to the department of natural resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021.** In Session Laws of Colorado 2021, section 2 of chapter 504, (SB 21-205), **amend** Part XIV as follows:




