Recommendation 6 was reviewed, discussed, and agreed to by the PUC and Department.

Discussion ensued regarding state and federal training programs, and timeline for implementing training standards.

Recommendations 7 thru 12 were reviewed, discussed, and agreed to by the PUC and Department.
