- S.B. 1 Concerning restrictions on the release of information relating to a person's driving record. Eliminates language which restricted the release of certain information concerning a person's driving record to only the person himself and law enforcement agencies.

APPROVED by Governor August 15

EFFECTIVE August 15

- S.B. 2 In-state tuition status - active duty members of the armed forces and their dependents stationed in Colorado. Provides that an active duty member of the armed forces and his dependents may be eligible for in-state tuition status at state institutions of higher education upon moving to Colorado on a permanent change-of-station basis, notwithstanding length of residency. Specifies that members and dependents who receive in-state tuition status shall not be considered in determining maximum enrollment for those institutions that are subject to enrollment caps. Provides that for purposes of calculating general fund support for the 1986-87 school year such students shall not be counted as residents. Requires the governing boards to report to the joint budget committee on the negative fiscal impact of granting such in-state tuition status. Directs the joint budget committee, subject to available funds, to consider restoring to the affected institutions those amounts reported as a negative fiscal impact.

Precludes a member of the armed forces or his dependents from receiving certain types of state financial aid on the basis of such tuition status until such time as the individual meets the length of residency requirement. Makes the in-state student classification inapplicable to courses taught on military bases.

Note: Although the effective date in the act is August 15, the act did not become law without the Governor's signature until August 29.

- S.B. 3 Controlled maintenance projects - executive director of the department of administration - increased flexibility. Authorizes the executive director of the department of administration, when the actual cost of a controlled maintenance program exceeds the amount appropriated for such project, to eliminate one or more projects and use the savings to cover such additional cost. Requires the

executive director to report quarterly to the capital development committee and the joint budget committee on any projects eliminated or completed under the provisions of the act.

Automatically repeals the law effective June 30, 1987.

S.B. 4 Dronabinol - schedule II controlled substance - availability by prescription. Makes the drug dronabinol (synthetic) in sesame oil and encapsulated in a soft gelatin capsule in a U.S. Food and Drug Administration approved drug product, available by prescription as a schedule II controlled substance under the "Colorado Controlled Substances Act". Excludes persons who use, possess, prescribe, dispense, or administer dronabinol pursuant to the "Colorado Controlled Substances Act" from criminal penalty.

S.B. 5 Community corrections - additional funding - consolidation of line items. Makes a supplemental appropriation to the division of criminal justice in the department of public safety to be used for the purchase of transition and diversion community corrections beds. Consolidates four line items in the 1986 general appropriation act concerning the purchase of community corrections services and adds a footnote expressing the legislative intent as to how the appropriation should be spent. The supplemental appropriation and the consolidation result in an overall increase of \$2,069,550 in the 1986-87 budget for the division of criminal justice.

H.B. 1001 Fiscal policy - technical corrections to House Bill No. 1340 enacted at the 1986 regular session. Decreases, in accordance with the statutory formula, the reduction amount for the top corporate income tax bracket from \$1,375.00 to \$1,125.00 for income tax years commencing on or after July 1, 1986, but before July 1, 1987, and from \$750.00 to \$625.00 for income tax years thereafter.

Amends a provision concerning metered users of cigarette excise tax stamps to conform with the language in House Bill No. 1340 which grants wholesalers the 20-day vendor delay for remittance of sales tax.

- H.B. 1002 Certificated personnel performance evaluations - records used in their preparation - exemption from public inspection - limitation. Exempts from public inspection the certificated personnel performance evaluation reports and all public records used in preparing such reports by limiting access to such data to the certificated person being evaluated and to the public officials who supervise such person's work. Limits exemption from public inspection in the case of the chief executive officer of the school district by allowing public inspection of such person's evaluation report in limited, specified instances.

- H.B. 1003 Department of labor and employment - supplemental appropriation - adjustment in source of funds - public safety. Amends the 1986 general appropriation act to adjust the mix of federal, cash, and general funding for the administrative budgets of the department and the division of labor. Also increases appropriations for indirect cost assessments and adds a new line item appropriation for public safety to the administrative budget of the division of labor.

- H.B. 1004 Speeding one to nine miles over the speed limit - penalty. Eliminates the distinction presently existing in the penalty assessment schedule between the fine imposed for driving 1 to 9 miles over the speed limit on interstate highways and the fine imposed for driving 1 to 9 miles over the speed limit on non-interstate highways by making the fine uniform at \$25.

H.B. 1005 Unemployment compensation - eligibility requirements - unemployment tax appeal procedures. Clarifies provisions regarding the consideration of types of remuneration defined as "other remuneration" in the determination of unemployment insurance compensation eligibility. Provides that appeals of unemployment insurance compensation tax determinations and penalties shall be to the industrial claim appeals office and the Colorado court of appeals, as provided for in article 74 of title 8, C.R.S.

H.B. 1006 Registration violations - penalty. Includes motor vehicle registration violations within the penalty assessment schedule and establishes the fine therefor at \$25.

APPROVED by Governor August 15 EFFECTIVE August 15

H.B. 1007 Supplemental appropriation - department of regulatory agencies. Amends the 1986 general appropriation act to increase the total appropriation to the division of racing events by \$101,365.

APPROVED by Governor August 25 EFFECTIVE August 25

H.B. 1008 Self-insured property fund - creation - scope - transfer - appropriation. Creates the self-insured property fund to establish a self-insurance reserve to pay claims of state agencies for loss or damage to state property. Requires the risk management division in the department of administration to investigate and adjust property claims of state agencies. Authorizes the executive director of the department of administration or his designee to pay such claims and to provide for the repair or replacement of property subject to available funds and certain specified limitations.

Specifies what claims can and cannot be paid out of the fund. Provides that the purchase of property insurance shall be out of the self-insured property fund and not out of the risk management fund. Specifies the types of hazards that are covered under the fund. Defines real and personal property. Clarifies that the controller's authority to provide for repair, replacement, or reconstruction of state property is not

effective if the state is self-insured for loss or damage to state property. Includes the Colorado state fair authority within the self-insured property fund.

Requires the state auditor to conduct an annual examination of the management and operation of the fund.

Makes the provisions relating to self-insurance for property claims apply to claims arising on or after July 1, 1986.

Automatically repeals the self-insured property fund July 1, 1988.

Transfers \$547,209 to the self-insured property fund, which represents moneys previously allocated for the 1986-87 fiscal year for property insurance purposes and which is available and unexpended due to the expiration of the state's property insurance policies. Appropriates \$6,800 out of the fund to the risk management division for operating expenses and travel expenses.

H.B. 1009 Ordway prison - expansion - appropriation - repeal of allocation for inmate art. Expands the capacity of the medium security prison under construction at Ordway, Colorado, from 500 beds to 740 beds. Appropriates \$7.5 million dollars for such expansion. Requires the construction contract to contain a provision prohibiting the contractor to claim any additional costs above contract price. Abolishes the requirement that one sixth of 1% of the capital construction appropriation for the new prison be spent on inmate art projects.

H.B. 1010 Severance tax trust fund - restoration and transfer to capital construction fund. Creates authority to transfer, subsequent to June 30, 1986, the sum of \$30,000,000 from the general fund to the severance tax trust fund and from the severance tax trust fund to the capital construction fund in the statutory manner provided for the restoration of moneys diverted from the severance tax trust fund by H.B. No. 1320 to the fiscal emergency fund in 1983.

H.B. 1011 Appropriation - department of health. Appropriates \$565,666 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1986, to the department of health for implementation of House Bill No. 1289, enacted during the 1986 regular session, concerning the control of motor vehicle air pollution under the AIR program.

H.B. 1012 Closing of the books for the 1985-86 fiscal year - transfers between appropriations. Makes various transfers between appropriations for the purpose of closing the books for the 1985-86 fiscal year. Also adjusts federal fund amounts to reflect reductions in the federal budget.
