Bill Summary

Under current law, a "head of a family" is allowed to brew beer for family use without obtaining a liquor license. The bill deletes the

terminology "head of a family" and "family use" and replaces it with "adult" and "personal use".

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-47-106, amend 3 (2) (a) as follows: 4 12-47-106. Exemptions. (2) (a) NOTWITHSTANDING any provision of this article or article 46 of this title to the contrary, 5 6 notwithstanding, when permitted by federal law and rules and regulations 7 promulgated pursuant thereto, a head of a family AN ADULT may produce, 8 for family PERSONAL use and not for sale, such AN amount of fermented 9 malt beverage or malt or vinous liquor as EQUAL TO THE AMOUNT THAT 10 is exempt from the federal excise tax on such THE alcohol beverage when 11 produced by a head of a family AN ADULT for family PERSONAL use and 12 not for sale. 13 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds, 14 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate 15 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
