### A BILL FOR AN ACT

### 101 CONCERNING PROFESSIONAL LICENSING FOR MILITARY VETERANS IN

102 CERTAIN PROFESSIONS.

#### **Bill Summary**

Section 1 of the bill requires the Colorado department of public health and environment (CDPHE) to consider crediting a military veteran's training, education, and experience toward the qualifications for certification as an emergency medical service provider.

**Section 2** of the bill requires the Colorado department of revenue (DOR) to consider crediting a military veteran's training, education, and

experience toward the qualifications for a commercial driver's license.

Section 3 of the bill requires the division of veterans affairs to make reasonable efforts to notify a discharged member of the obligations of CDPHE and DOR under sections 1 and 2 of the bill and of the duties and functions of a professional licensing authority that is regulated by the department of regulatory agencies.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 25-3.5-203, amend
3 (1) (d) (II) as follows:

4 25-3.5-203. Emergency medical service providers -5 certification - renewal of certificate - duties of department - rules -6 criminal history record checks - definitions. (1) (d) (II) Upon 7 presentation of satisfactory evidence by an applicant for CERTIFICATION 8 OR renewal of certification, the department SHALL CONSIDER AND may 9 accept continuing medical education, training, or service completed by an 10 individual as a member of the armed forces or reserves of the United 11 States, the National Guard of any state, the military reserves of any state, 12 or the naval militia of any state toward the qualifications to renew OR 13 GRANT the individual's certification.

SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 42-2-403, add (5) as
follows:

42-2-403. Department authority - rules - federal requirements.
(5) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LAW OR RULE TO THE CONTRARY, UPON
PRESENTATION OF SATISFACTORY EVIDENCE BY AN APPLICANT, THE
DEPARTMENT:

20 (a) SHALL CONSIDER THE TRAINING, EDUCATION, OR EXPERIENCE
21 OBTAINED BY AN APPLICANT AS A MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED
22 FORCES OR RESERVES, THE NATIONAL GUARD OF ANY STATE, THE

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1 MILITARY RESERVES OF ANY STATE, OR THE NAVAL MILITIA OF ANY STATE;

2 AND

3 (b) MAY CREDIT THE TRAINING, EDUCATION, OR EXPERIENCE
4 TOWARD THE QUALIFICATIONS TO RECEIVE A LICENSE, CERTIFICATION, OR
5 REGISTRATION.

6 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 28-5-705, amend (1)
7 (g); and add (1) (h) as follows:

8 28-5-705. Duties. (1) The division, in accordance with its rules,
9 shall perform the following duties and functions:

(g) Prepare, develop, construct, and maintain a state military
 veterans' cemetery pursuant to section 28-5-708 and seek reimbursement
 from the federal department of veterans affairs for all allowable costs for
 such THE project as permitted by federal law; AND

(h) MAKE REASONABLE EFFORTS TO NOTIFY MEMBERS OF THE
ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES WHO ARE PLANNING THEIR RETURN
TO CIVILIAN LIFE AND ARE LOCATED IN COLORADO, OR INTEND TO
RELOCATE TO COLORADO UPON DISCHARGE, OF THE REQUIREMENTS IN
SECTIONS 24-34-102 (8) AND (8.5), 25-3.5-203, AND 42-2-403, C.R.S.
SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,

determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
