NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

No later than September 16, 2016, this bill requires that the State Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education (SBCCOE) convene a public forum to discuss developing a model for the creation and use of micro-credentials as evidence of student learning. The bill identifies the desired participants and topics to be discussed at the forum. The SBCCOE is required to summarize the findings and recommendations that arise from the public forum, post them on their website, and submit them to the Colorado Commission on Higher Education, the State Board of Education, the State Workforce Development Council, the Governor, and the education committees of the General Assembly.

State Expenditures

The bill increases expenditures for the SBCCOE in FY 2016-17 to convene a public forum and prepare a summary report. This expense is estimated at \$8,375 and includes facilities rental, materials preparation, facilitator fees, subject matter experts, and staff travel. In addition, the SBCCOE will have increased staff workload to organize the event, prepare invitation and registration materials, hire paid participants, and perform other event management tasks.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Education Committee on March 28, 2016.

State Appropriations

For FY 2016-17, this bill would have required a General Fund appropriation of \$8,375 to the State Board for Community Colleges and Occupational Education.
