A BILL FOR AN ACT

01	CONCERNING CREATION OF A GRANT PROGRAM TO SUPPORT A SHARED
02	PEACE OFFICER AUXILIARY, AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH,
03	MAKING AN APPROPRIATION.

Bill Summary

The bill creates the reserve academy grant program to provide a one-time grant to a political subdivision of the state that is comprised of multiple participating jurisdictions and that is formed for the purpose of funding a reserve peace officer academy that will train and certify a shared reserve peace officer auxiliary group. SENATE Amended 2nd Reading March 17, 2017 security and emergency management (division) will administer the grant program. The division may accept gifts, grants, and donations to use towards the grant program. The division shall consider the following criteria in awarding the grant:

! Existing access to start-up capital;

- ! The capacity to serve communities statewide; and
- ! The ability to assist law enforcement agencies in times of need.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Legislative declaration. (1) The general assembly hereby finds and declares that:

- (a) There exist in Colorado multiple jurisdictions that want to collaborate in order to create a shared reserve peace officer auxiliary group that would provide support and assistance to municipal governments and local, county, and state law enforcement agencies in the state;
- (b) Members of these groups often work in peace officer positions similar to reserve peace officers, without peace officer training and certification provided by the peace officers standards and training board; and
- (c) An auxiliary group with peace officer training and certification provided by the peace officers standards and training board is in the interest of professional policing in Colorado and better serves local government and local law enforcement agencies in the state.
- (2) Therefore, the general assembly determines that it is necessary to provide one-time funding for a reserve peace officer training academy in order for a political subdivision of the state that is comprised of multiple jurisdictions to create a shared reserve peace officer auxiliary group that serves the jurisdictions.

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1	SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 24-33.5-1616 as
2	follows:

4	rules - repeal. (1) There is created in the division the reserve
5	ACADEMY GRANT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE A GRANT TO A POLITICAL
6	SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE THAT IS COMPRISED OF MULTIPLE
7	JURISDICTIONS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CREATING A RESERVE PEACE OFFICER
8	TRAINING ACADEMY THAT WILL TRAIN AND CERTIFY A RESERVE PEACE
9	OFFICER AUXILIARY GROUP. THE DIVISION MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND
10	EXPEND GIFTS, GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES
11	FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.
12	(2) The grant recipient may use the money received

15	(3) THE DIVISION SHALL ADMINISTER THE GRANT PROGRAM AND,

4	(b) THE DIVISION SHALL REVIEW THE APPLICATIONS RECEIVED
5	PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. IN AWARDING THE GRANT, THE DIVISION
6	SHALL CONSIDER THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA:
7	(I) EXISTING ACCESS TO START-UP CAPITAL;
8	(II) THE CAPACITY TO SERVE COMMUNITIES STATEWIDE; AND
9	(III) THE ABILITY TO ASSIST LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES IN
10	TIMES OF NEED.
11	(c) Subject to available appropriations, on or before
12	DECEMBER 31, 2017, THE DIVISION SHALL AWARD A GRANT AS PROVIDED
13	IN THIS SECTION. THE DIVISION SHALL DISTRIBUTE THE GRANT MONEY
14	WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE DIVISION AWARDS THE GRANT.
15	(6) This section is repealed, effective July 1, 2019.
16	SECTION 3. Appropriation. For the 2017-18 state fiscal year,
17	\$814,834 is appropriated to the department of public safety for use by the
18	office of preparedness. This appropriation is from the marijuana tax cash
19	fund created in section 39-28.8-501 (1), C.R.S. To implement this act, the
20	office may use this appropriation as follows:
21	(a) \$14,834 for personal services, which amount is based on an
22	assumption that the department will require an additional 0.3 FTE; and
23	(b) \$800,000 for the reserve academy grant program.
24	SECTION 4. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
25	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
26	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.

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
