Bill Summary

Under the existing tuition assistance program for students enrolled in career and technical education certificate programs (certificate programs), students enrolled in certificate programs may qualify for tuition assistance if they meet the income eligibility requirements for the federal Pell grant program but the certificate program does not meet the SENATE nd Reading Unamended March 14, 2017

> HOUSE 3rd Reading Unamended March 1, 2017

HOUSE 2nd Reading Unamended February 28, 2017 Pell grant minimum credit hour requirements. Under the bill, the tuition assistance program is available to students who are enrolled in certificate programs that do not meet the minimum credit hour requirements for the federal Pell grant program and who meet an income eligibility standard set by the Colorado commission on higher education. The bill clarifies that tuition assistance means money a student may use to pay for tuition, fees, and course materials.

SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-3.3-1101, amend

(1) as follows:

23-3.3-1101. Career and technical education certificate programs - tuition assistance - funding - definitions. (1) (a) The commission shall establish a tuition assistance program for students enrolled in OUALIFYING career and technical education certificate programs. referred to in this section as "certificate programs". Subject to available appropriations, the commission shall allocate moneys MONEY to community colleges, Colorado Mesa university, area technical colleges, and local district junior colleges to provide tuition assistance for students who are enrolled in qualifying career and technical EDUCATION CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS AND meet the income eligibility requirements for the federal Pell grant but do not qualify for the Pell grant because the certificate program in which they are enrolled does not meet the Pell grant minimum credit hour requirements ESTABLISHED IN GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE COMMISSION. The department of higher education and the institutions that receive tuition assistance moneys MONEY pursuant to this section shall administer the program in accordance with policies and procedures that the commission establishes.

(b) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

4	REQUIREMENTS FOR THE FEDERAL PELL GRANT PROGRAM.
5	(II) "TUITION ASSISTANCE" MEANS MONEY THAT A STUDENT MAY
6	USE TO PAY FOR TUITION, FEES, AND COURSE MATERIALS.
7	SECTION 2. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
8	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
9	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
