A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE REQUIREMENT OF UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP TO**
102 **BE A PEACE OFFICER IN COLORADO.**

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The "Immigration and Nationality Act" allows states to pass laws requiring United States citizenship as a condition of employment. The bill imposes a United States citizenship requirement for peace officers, including certified peace officers, in Colorado.

A person who is a legal permanent resident and who is employed by a law enforcement agency as a peace officer or certified peace officer

on the effective date of the bill is exempted from the United States citizenship requirement until July 1, 2020. A person who is a legal permanent resident and is a certified peace officer but not employed on the effective date of the bill is exempted from the United States citizenship requirement until July 1, 2020. If the person fails to obtain United States citizenship during the grandfathered-time period, the P.O.S.T. board shall revoke the person's peace officer certification, if applicable.

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 16-2.5-101.5 as
3 follows:

4 **16-2.5-101.5. Peace officer and certified peace officers - United**
5 **States citizenship required - grandfather provision - repeal.** (1) ON
6 AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, IN ADDITION TO ALL
7 STANDARDS IMPOSED BY LAW ON A PEACE OFFICER, A PERSON WHO IS A
8 PEACE OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 16-2.5-101, IS REQUIRED TO BE A
9 CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES.

10 (2) ON AND AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, IN
11 ADDITION TO ALL STANDARDS IMPOSED BY LAW ON A CERTIFIED PEACE
12 OFFICER, A PERSON WHO IS A CERTIFIED PEACE OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN
13 SECTION 16-2.5-102, IS REQUIRED TO BE A CITIZEN OF THE UNITED STATES.

14 (3) (a) A PERSON WHO IS A LEGAL PERMANENT RESIDENT OF THE
15 UNITED STATES AND WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY
16 AS A PEACE OFFICER OR CERTIFIED PEACE OFFICER ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE
17 OF THIS SECTION IS EXEMPTED FROM THE UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP
18 REQUIREMENT UNTIL JULY 1, 2020. A PERSON WHO IS A LEGAL PERMANENT
19 RESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND IS A CERTIFIED PEACE OFFICER BUT
20 NOT EMPLOYED ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION IS EXEMPTED
21 FROM THE UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENT UNTIL JULY 1, 2020.

1 (b) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SUBSECTION (3), AN ADULT PROBATION
2 OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 16-2.5-137, AND A JUVENILE PROBATION
3 OFFICER, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 16-2.5-138, ARE CONSIDERED TO BE
4 EMPLOYED BY A LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY.

5 (c) THIS SUBSECTION (3) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

6 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-31-305, **add** (5)
7 as follows:

8 **24-31-305. Certification - issuance - renewal - revocation -**
9 **repeal.** (5) (a) ON AND AFTER JULY 1, 2020, THE P.O.S.T. BOARD SHALL
10 REVOKE THE CERTIFICATION OF ANY PEACE OFFICER WHO FAILS TO MEET
11 THE UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENT SPECIFIED IN SECTION
12 16-2.5-101.5.

13 (b) THIS SUBSECTION (5) IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021.

14 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
15 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
16 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
