BILL TOPIC: BEEF COUNTRY OF ORIGIN RETAIL PLACARD

NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

This bill requires anyone selling meat at retail to the public to conspicuously display a placard next to the beef designating it as either "U.S.A. Beef" or "Imported," depending on where the animals were born, raised, and slaughtered. If imported, the placard must indicate the beef's country of origin. The Department of Public Health and Environment may adopt rules to enforce this provision.

State Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2017-18, this bill increases workload by a minimal amount in the Department of Public Health and Environment to enforce the rules of the bill. No change in appropriations is required.

Effective Date

The bill was postponed indefinitely by the House Agriculture Committee on April 25, 2017.
