BILL TOPIC: TRANSFER STUDENT THREAT AND SUICIDE ASSESSMENT DOCUMENTS

NOTE: This bill was not enacted into law; therefore, the impacts identified in this analysis do not take effect.

Summary of Legislation

The bill requires a public school, charter school, pilot school, or out-of-home placement to forward a copy of any threat or suicide assessment it has in its possession when a student transfers to a new public school and a request is made for his or her school records. The bill establishes criteria for identifying which records meet the definition of a threat or suicide assessment.

State Expenditures

Beginning in the current FY 2016-17, the bill increases workload for the Division of Youth Corrections in the Department of Human Services to forward any threat or suicide assessment documentation when requested. This workload increase is minimal and does not require a change in appropriations.

Local Government Impact

Similar to the state, workload for schools increases to forward any requested threat or suicide assessments to other public schools.

Effective Date

The bill is deemed lost since the House of Representatives laid the bill over until May 11, 2017, during second reading on May 4, 2017.
