**Summary of Legislation**

Under current law, the Board of Commissioners for Veterans Community Living Centers is scheduled to repeal on July 1, 2017. This bill eliminates the repeal date of the board, continuing it indefinitely.

**Background**

The Board of Commissioners for Veterans Community Living Centers is housed in the Department of Human Services, and it advises the Division of Veterans Community Living Centers and the veterans community living centers themselves. The board is comprised of seven members, who serve four-year terms and are appointed by the Governor, with consent of the Senate.

**State Expenditures**

By continuing the Board of Commissioners, the bill will increase state cash fund expenditures in the Department of Human Services by a minimal amount (\$600) beginning in FY 2017-18 to reimburse board members for travel and other expenses. These costs represent a continuation of the current expenses incurred by the board. Funding for these expenses is included in the department's base budget request for FY 2017-18, so no appropriation is required.

**Effective Date**

The bill was signed into law by the Governor and took effect on June 1, 2017.
