Summary of Legislation

Under current law, a pharmacist may supervise up to three persons who are either pharmacy interns or pharmacy technicians. This bill removes that limitation. If three or more pharmacy technicians are on duty, at least one must have certain qualifications.

State Expenditures

The Pharmacy Board and the Division of Professions and Occupations in the Department of Regulatory Agencies will have a minimal workload increase for outreach to pharmacies and rulemaking as a result of this bill in FY 2017-18. The workload increase can be accomplished within existing appropriations.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
