BILL TOPIC: DRIVER'S PERMIT LICENSE DISABILITY ADMINISTRATION

Summary of Legislation

This bill clarifies that a person with a disability may obtain a temporary instruction permit for driving using the existing procedures and requirements that apply to other instruction permits, modified based on the disability. This instruction permit expires after three years.

Additionally, this bill instructs the Department of Revenue (DOR) to make a reasonable effort to ensure that confidential records are not accessible to the public. DOR must establish procedures to protect the contents of the records against inadvertent disclosure.

Assessment

As persons with disabilities may already obtain a temporary instruction permit for driving and the DOR currently has procedures in place to ensure confidential records are not accessible to the public, this bill codifies current practice. As such, this bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
