BILL TOPIC: AUTHORITY OF THE JOINT TECHNOLOGY COMMITTEE

Summary of Legislation

This bill, **recommended by the Joint Technology Committee (JTC)**, adds to the authority of the JTC the ability to request information and presentations about data privacy and cybersecurity and to coordinate with the Colorado Cybersecurity Council. The bill amends a requirement for the committee to review and make recommendations to the General Assembly about certain legislation to include legislation related to data privacy and cybersecurity.

Under current law, the JTC will repeal on July 1, 2018. The bill eliminates the repeal of the committee.

Assessment

The JTC meets regularly on a year-round basis. The bill is assessed as having no fiscal impact because it is not expected to add to the number of meetings or resources allocated to the committee. Adding new topics of study will not affect the existing workloads of the Governor's Office of Information Technology, Legislative Council Staff, or the Office of Legislative Legal Services.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 9, 2017, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 10, 2017, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
