A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING A BAN ON VOTE TRADING.**

Bill Summary

The bill makes it a misdemeanor criminal offense for a person to trade a vote or offer to trade a vote with another elector in this state or a person in another state in exchange for the other person's vote for or against a particular candidate, ballot issue, or ballot question.

1 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 1-13-720, **amend** (1)
2 introductory portion; and **add** (1)(d) as follows:

3 **1-13-720. Unlawfully giving or promising money or**
4 **employment or engaging in vote trading.** (1) It is unlawful for any
5 person, directly or indirectly, ~~by himself~~ INDIVIDUALLY or through any
6 other person:

7 (d) TO TRADE A VOTE OR OFFER TO TRADE A VOTE WITH ANOTHER
8 ELECTOR IN THE STATE OR A PERSON IN ANOTHER STATE IN EXCHANGE FOR
9 THE OTHER PERSON'S VOTE FOR OR AGAINST A PARTICULAR CANDIDATE,
10 BALLOT ISSUE, OR BALLOT QUESTION.

11 **SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date -**
12 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect September 1, 2018; except that,
13 if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of
14 the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
15 within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general
16 assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless
17 approved by the people at the general election to be held in November
18 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on January 1, 2019, or on the date
19 of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor, whichever
20 is later.

21 (2) This act applies to elections conducted on or after the
22 applicable effective date of this act.
