A BILL FOR AN ACT CONCERNING MAKING CERTAIN RECORDS OF THE STATE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT SUBJECT TO THE COLORADO OPEN RECORDS ACT.

Bill Summary

Current law exempts the judicial department from the Colorado open records act (CORA). The bill makes the administrative and budget records of the judicial department subject to CORA.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

1	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-72-202, add
2	(6)(a)(V) as follows:
3	24-72-202. Definitions. As used in this part 2, unless the context
4	otherwise requires:
5	(6) (a) (V) "PUBLIC RECORDS" MEANS AND INCLUDES
6	ADMINISTRATIVE AND BUDGET RECORDS OF THE JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT OF
7	STATE GOVERNMENT.
8	SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
9	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
10	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August
11	8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a
12	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
13	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
14	within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
15	unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in
16	November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
17	official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
