# A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 101 CONCERNING A PROHIBITION AGAINST A MENTAL HEALTH CARE
- 102 **PROVIDER ENGAGING IN CONVERSION THERAPY WITH A PATIENT**
- 103 **UNDER EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE.**

#### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill prohibits a licensed physician specializing in psychiatry or a licensed, certified, or registered mental health care provider from engaging in conversion therapy with a patient under 18 years of age. A licensee who engages in these efforts is subject to disciplinary action by the appropriate licensing board. "Conversion therapy" means efforts that seek to change an individual's sexual orientation, including efforts to change behaviors or gender expressions or to eliminate or reduce sexual or romantic attraction or feelings toward individuals of the same sex.

1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-36-102.5, amend 3 the introductory portion; and **add** (5.5) as follows: 4 12-36-102.5. Definitions. As used in this article ARTICLE 36, 5 unless the context otherwise requires: 6 "CONVERSION THERAPY" MEANS ANY PRACTICE BY A (5.5)7 LICENSEE SPECIALIZING IN THE PRACTICE OF PSYCHIATRY THAT SEEKS TO 8 CHANGE AN INDIVIDUAL'S SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY, 9 INCLUDING EFFORTS TO CHANGE BEHAVIORS OR GENDER EXPRESSIONS OR 10 TO ELIMINATE OR REDUCE SEXUAL OR ROMANTIC ATTRACTION OR 11 FEELINGS TOWARD INDIVIDUALS OF THE SAME SEX. THE TERM DOES NOT 12 INCLUDE: 13 (a) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ACCEPTANCE, SUPPORT, AND 14 UNDERSTANDING FOR THE FACILITATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S COPING, 15 SOCIAL SUPPORT, AND IDENTITY EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT, 16 INCLUDING SEXUAL-ORIENTATION-NEUTRAL INTERVENTIONS TO PREVENT 17 OR ADDRESS UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR UNSAFE SEXUAL PRACTICES, AS 18 LONG AS THE COUNSELING DOES NOT SEEK TO CHANGE SEXUAL 19 ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY; OR 20 (b) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO A PERSON 21 UNDERGOING GENDER TRANSITION. 22 SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-36-117, add 23 (1)(nn) as follows: 24 12-36-117. **Unprofessional conduct.** (1) "Unprofessional

4 SECTION 3. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43-201, add (1.6)
5 as follows:

6 12-43-201. Definitions. As used in this article 43, unless the
7 context otherwise requires:

"CONVERSION THERAPY" MEANS ANY PRACTICE BY A 8 (1.6)9 LICENSEE, CERTIFICATE HOLDER, OR REGISTRANT THAT SEEKS TO CHANGE 10 AN INDIVIDUAL'S SEXUAL ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY, INCLUDING 11 EFFORTS TO CHANGE BEHAVIORS OR GENDER EXPRESSIONS OR TO 12 ELIMINATE OR REDUCE SEXUAL OR ROMANTIC ATTRACTION OR FEELINGS 13 TOWARD INDIVIDUALS OF THE SAME SEX. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE: 14 (a) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ACCEPTANCE, SUPPORT, AND 15 UNDERSTANDING FOR THE FACILITATION OF AN INDIVIDUAL'S COPING, 16 SOCIAL SUPPORT, AND IDENTITY EXPLORATION AND DEVELOPMENT, 17 INCLUDING SEXUAL-ORIENTATION-NEUTRAL INTERVENTIONS TO PREVENT 18 OR ADDRESS UNLAWFUL CONDUCT OR UNSAFE SEXUAL PRACTICES, AS 19 LONG AS THE COUNSELING DOES NOT SEEK TO CHANGE SEXUAL 20 ORIENTATION OR GENDER IDENTITY; OR

(b) PSYCHOTHERAPIES THAT PROVIDE ASSISTANCE TO A PERSONUNDERGOING GENDER TRANSITION.

23 SECTION 4. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-43-222, amend
24 (1)(w) and (1)(x); and add (1)(y) as follows:

12-43-222. Prohibited activities - related provisions. (1) A
person licensed, registered, or certified under this article 43 violates this
article 43 if he or she:

(w) Has sold or fraudulently obtained or furnished a license,
 registration, or certification to practice as a psychologist, social worker,
 marriage and family therapist, licensed professional counselor,
 psychotherapist, or addiction counselor or has aided or abetted in such
 activities; or

6 (x) Has failed to respond, in the manner required by the board, to
7 a complaint filed with or by the board against the licensee, registrant, or
8 certificate holder; OR

9 (y) HAS ENGAGED IN CONVERSION THERAPY WITH A PATIENT
10 UNDER EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE.

11 SECTION 5. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 12 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 13 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 14 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a 15 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 16 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 17 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect 18 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in 19 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the 20 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
