A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING MODIFICATIONS TO THE "NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR**
102 **ACT", AND, IN CONNECTION THEREWITH, REQUIRING A**
103 **NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR TO DISCLOSE THAT THE**
104 **NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IS REGISTERED AND UPDATING THE**
105 **TERMS THAT A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR MAY USE.**

Bill Summary

- ! treatment disclose that the naturopathic doctor is registered;
- ! Removes the requirement that naturopathic doctors use the term "registered" in the naturopathic doctor's title;
- ! Requires a naturopathic doctor to qualify any specialty services provided to the public with "naturopathic" or "naturopath"; and
- ! Clarifies the circumstances under which a naturopathic doctor can use the term "physician".

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-105, **amend**
3 (3)(b) as follows:

4 **12-37.3-105. Practice of naturopathic medicine by**
5 **naturopathic doctors - exclusions - protected activities - rules.**

6 (3) (b) Before conducting an initial examination of a patient, a
7 naturopathic doctor shall obtain the patient's informed consent to the
8 examination, evidenced by a written statement in a form prescribed by the
9 director and signed by both the patient and the naturopathic doctor. The
10 statement must:

11 (I) Disclose that the naturopathic doctor is not a medical doctor or
12 physician licensed under article 36 of this title **12**;

13 (II) Recommend that the patient have a relationship with a
14 MEDICAL DOCTOR OR licensed physician; ~~and~~

15 (III) Indicate that the naturopathic doctor will attempt to develop
16 and maintain a collaborative relationship with the patient's LICENSED
17 physician, if the patient has a relationship with a licensed physician; **AND**

18 (IV) **DISCLOSE THAT THE NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR IS REGISTERED**
19 **AND NOT LICENSED.**

20 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 12-37.3-110, **amend**
21 (2), (3)(a), and (4); and **add** (2.5) as follows:

1 **12-37.3-110. Persons entitled to practice as naturopathic**
2 **doctors - title protection for naturopathic doctors.** (2) A naturopathic
3 doctor may use the title "~~registered~~ "naturopathic doctor", or "~~registered~~
4 "doctor of naturopathy", or the initials "~~R.N.D.~~" "N.D."

5 (2.5) A NATUROPATHIC DOCTOR SHALL QUALIFY ANY SPECIALTY
6 SERVICES PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC WITH "NATUROPATHIC" OR
7 "NATUROPATH".

8 (3) A naturopathic doctor shall not use:

9 (a) The term "physician" IN DESCRIBING THE NATUROPATHIC
10 DOCTOR'S REGISTERED NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE PRACTICE IN THIS STATE.

12 (4) Nothing in this section prevents a naturopathic doctor from
13 disclosing membership in national organizations or associations of
14 naturopathic physicians UNLESS THE DISCLOSURE IS FALSE, MISLEADING,
15 OR DECEPTIVE.

16 **SECTION 3. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
17 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
