A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION  
102 MAINTENANCE FUND.

Bill Summary

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. **Capital Development Committee.** The bill creates the governor's mansion maintenance fund (fund), which is comprised of the money generated from the mansion's operation, such as rental fees. Subject to annual appropriation by the general assembly, the governor's office may expend money from the fund for any operating costs for any governor's mansion activities and the department of personnel may expend money

from the fund for controlled maintenance of the governor's mansion, except that any appropriation for controlled maintenance is subject to the capital development committee's review. The bill also specifies that the department of personnel is still authorized to seek controlled maintenance funding for the mansion through the existing statutory request process if the money in the fund is insufficient to cover all controlled maintenance needs.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2           **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 24-30-1303.8 as  
3 follows:

4           **24-30-1303.8. Governor's mansion maintenance fund -**  
5 **creation - report.** (1) (a) THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION MAINTENANCE  
6 FUND, REFERRED TO IN THIS SECTION AS THE "FUND", IS HEREBY CREATED  
7 IN THE STATE TREASURY. THE FUND CONSISTS OF MONEY EARNED FROM  
8 THE OPERATION OF THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION, SUCH AS RENTAL FEES,  
9 WHICH MONEY IS CREDITED TO THE FUND BY THE STATE TREASURER, AND  
10 ANY OTHER MONEY THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY MAY APPROPRIATE OR  
11 TRANSFER TO THE FUND; EXCEPT THAT THE FUND BALANCE MAY NOT  
12 EXCEED FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS AT THE CLOSE OF ANY FISCAL  
13 YEAR. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT ALL INTEREST AND INCOME  
14 DERIVED FROM THE DEPOSIT AND INVESTMENT OF MONEY IN THE FUND TO  
15 THE FUND. SUBJECT TO ANNUAL APPROPRIATION BY THE GENERAL  
16 ASSEMBLY, THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE MAY EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND  
17 FOR ANY OPERATING COSTS FOR ANY GOVERNOR'S MANSION ACTIVITIES  
18 AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY EXPEND MONEY FROM THE FUND FOR  
19 CONTROLLED MAINTENANCE OF THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION; EXCEPT THAT  
20 THE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE SHALL REVIEW ANY  
21 APPROPRIATION REQUESTS FOR CONTROLLED MAINTENANCE AND SHALL  
22 FORWARD ITS RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE JOINT BUDGET COMMITTEE.

1 (b) NO LATER THAN DECEMBER 1, 2018, AND EACH DECEMBER 1  
2 THEREAFTER, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE A REPORT TO THE CAPITAL  
3 DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE REGARDING THE FUND BALANCE AND  
4 INFORMATION REGARDING THE CONTROLLED MAINTENANCE NEEDS OF THE  
5 GOVERNOR'S MANSION.

6 (2) IF THE MONEY IN THE FUND IS INSUFFICIENT TO COVER THE  
7 COST OF A CONTROLLED MAINTENANCE PROJECT, THE DEPARTMENT MAY  
8 SUBMIT A CONTROLLED MAINTENANCE BUDGET REQUEST FOR THE  
9 GOVERNOR'S MANSION WITH THE OFFICE OF STATE PLANNING AND  
10 BUDGETING TO BE INCLUDED WITH THE OFFICE OF STATE PLANNING AND  
11 BUDGETING'S SUBMISSION TO THE CAPITAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE  
12 MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 24-37-304 (1)(c.3)(I)(D).

13 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 24-75-402, **amend**  
14 (5)(ll) and (5)(mm); and **add** (5)(nn) as follows:

15 **24-75-402. Cash funds - limit on uncommitted reserves -**  
16 **reduction in amount of fees - exclusions - repeal.** (5) Notwithstanding  
17 any provision of this section to the contrary, the following cash funds are  
18 excluded from the limitations specified in this section:

19 (ll) The technology advancement and emergency fund created in  
20 section 24-37.5-115; ~~and~~

21 (mm) The division of youth services pilot program cash fund  
22 created in section 19-2-203 (4); AND

23 (nn) THE GOVERNOR'S MANSION MAINTENANCE FUND CREATED IN  
24 SECTION 24-30-1303.8.

25 **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
26 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
27 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

1 8, 2018, if adjournment sine die is on May 9, 2018); except that, if a  
2 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
3 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
4 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
5 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
6 November 2018 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
