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ENJOINED LAWS ON BALLOT ISSUE PETITION CIRCULATORS **Bill Topic:**

Summary of No fiscal impact. This bill removes statutory provisions concerning petition **Fiscal Impact:** circulators that were declared unconstitutional and enjoined from enforcement. It has

no fiscal impact on any state or local government.

Appropriation Summary:

No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status:

The fiscal note reflects the introduced bill, which was recommended by the Statutory

Revision Committee.

Summary of Legislation

This bill repeals the following provisions concerning petition circulators that were declared unconstitutional and permanently enjoined from enforcement:

- that petition circulators must be residents of Colorado; and
- that petition circulators cannot be paid more than 20 percent of their total compensation on a per signature basis.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

Given that these provisions are not currently enforced following the ruling by the federal court, repealing these provisions will have no impact on the revenue, expenditures, or workload of any state or local government entity. Therefore, it is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 8, 2018, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 9, 2018, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
