#### **Current Appropriations Clause in Bill**

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides \$1,555,293 cash funds from the Stationary Sources Control Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2018-19.

### **Description of Amendments in This Packet**

J.001 Staff has prepared amendment J.001 (attached) to fix an error in the title of the bill.

### **Points to Consider**

#### Future Budget Processes

The Revised Fiscal Note indicates that if the fees addressed by this bill are set at their statutory cap, then revenue will exceed the appropriation provided in this bill. In the event that the Air Quality Control Commission increases fees paid by stationary sources of air pollutants to generate revenue in excess of the bill's appropriation, the Department of Public Health and Environment will have to

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submit a budget request to adjust FY 2018-19 appropriations mid-year, or to adjust appropriations for FY 2019-20.

### Related Budget Information

As noted on page 2 of the Revised Fiscal Note, H.B. 18-1322 (FY 2018-19 Long Bill) reduced the appropriation from the Stationary Sources Control Fund by \$1,555,293 to align spending authority with anticipated revenue and the Fund's projected fund balance. The appropriation clause in this bill restores that spending authority based on the assumption that the statutory fee caps will be raised and that the Air Quality Control Commission will increase fees.
