Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that appropriates \$141,744 General Fund to the Legislative Department for use by the Office of the State Auditor for FY 2018-19 to expand an ongoing independent evaluation of the State's information technology resources to include a review and evaluation of the procurement process for a recent major information technology project known as HRWorks.

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee (JBC) has proposed a budget package for FY 2018-19 based on the March 2018 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The JBC has included as part of its FY 2018-19 budget package a \$141,744 General Fund appropriation for FY 2018-19 for implementation of this bill.
