## **Points to Consider**

## General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2018-19 based on the March 2018 Office of State Planning and Budgeting revenue forecast. The budget package leaves approximately \$40.8 million General Fund unallocated. Thus, the General Assembly could appropriate up to \$38.3 million General Fund to fund 2018 legislation and maintain a 6.5 percent General Fund reserve. This bill transfers \$500,000 General Fund to the Local Firefighter Safety and Disease Prevention Cash Fund on July 1, 2018, reducing the excess General Fund reserve by \$500,000.
