Summary of Legislation

On July 1, 2018, the bill transfers \$250,000 from the General Fund to the Local Firefighter Safety and Disease Prevention Cash Fund. Individual grants from the cash fund may not exceed \$25,000.

State Transfers

On July 1, 2018, the bill transfers \$250,000 from the General Fund to the Local Firefighter Safety and Disease Prevention Cash Fund.

State Expenditures

The bill increases state expenditures by \$125,000 in both FY 2018-19 and FY 2019-20. This fiscal note assumes that grant funding will be allocated in roughly equal amounts across the next two fiscal years.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.

State Appropriations

The Local Firefighter Safety and Disease Prevention Cash Fund is continuously appropriated to the DPS; no appropriation is required.
