Summary of Legislation

This bill removes statutory references to the now obsolete home- and community-based services (HCBS) waiver program for persons living with AIDS.

Background

Colorado currently administers 11 HCBS waiver programs. HCBS waivers provide additional services to specified populations with the purpose of keeping eligible clients in their homes and out of nursing facilities.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

Clients receiving services through the People Living with AIDS HCBS waiver were moved to the Elderly, Blind, and Disabled HCBS waiver as of April 1, 2014. The bill is has no effect on state or local government revenue, expenditures, or workload, and therefore, is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 8, 2018, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 9, 2018, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
