2	policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017. (1) For
3	the 2017-18 state fiscal year, \$26,943,875 is appropriated to the
4	department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of
5	overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of
6	section 2 of chapter 421 (SB 17-254), Session Laws of Colorado 2017,
7	as follows:
8	(a) \$17,847,003 from the general fund for medical services
9	premiums;
10	(b) \$444,003 from the general fund for behavioral health capitation
11	payments;
12	(c) \$1,265,019 for the children's basic health plan medical and
