#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING THE CREATION OF A GRANT PROGRAM TO INCREASE THE
102 NUMBER OF SCHOOL NURSES.

### **Bill Summary**

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill creates the school nurse grant program (grant program) in the department of public health and environment (department).

The grant program awards grants to local education providers, as defined in the bill, to hire school nurses to serve in public schools. Grants are awarded on a 5-year grant cycle, with an initial one-year grant, renewable for an additional 4 years, as long as there is a school nurse in

the grant-funded position and the grant money is being used for authorized purposes.

Subject to annual appropriations from the general assembly, the department shall recommend grant recipients, and the state board of health shall annually award up to \$3 million during the 5-year grant cycle. Once the 5-year grant cycle is complete, the department shall administer a new grant cycle.

The department may expend a portion of the grant money for reasonable and necessary administrative expenses.

In each year in which school nurse grants are awarded, the department shall report to certain committees of the general assembly concerning the grant program.

8	(6) (a) Subject to available appropriations, the state
9	BOARD SHALL AWARD UP TO THREE MILLION DOLLARS ANNUALLY IN
10	GRANTS. EACH GRANT HAS AN INITIAL TERM OF ONE YEAR AND SHALL BE
11	RENEWED ANNUALLY FOR AN ADDITIONAL FOUR YEARS AS LONG AS A
12	SCHOOL NURSE IS RETAINED IN THE GRANT-FUNDED POSITION AND THE
13	LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER CONTINUES TO USE THE GRANT MONEY FOR
14	AUTHORIZED PURPOSES. THE STATE BOARD MAY FUND MORE THAN ONE
15	SCHOOL NURSE POSITION PER GRANT RECIPIENT. THE AMOUNT OF THE
16	GRANT MUST COVER UP TO THE COST OF HIRING A SCHOOL NURSE POSITION
17	OR POSITIONS IN THE LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER'S SELECTED SCHOOL OR
18	SCHOOLS.
19	(b) SUBJECT TO AVAILABLE APPROPRIATIONS, AT THE END OF THE
20	INITIAL FIVE-YEAR GRANT CYCLE AND EACH SUBSEQUENT FIVE-YEAR
21	GRANT CYCLE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SOLICIT AND REVIEW GRANT
22	APPLICATIONS, AND THE STATE BOARD SHALL AWARD NEW GRANTS.
23	(c) The department shall review grant program
24	APPLICATIONS AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE STATE BOARD
25	CONCERNING THE AWARD OF GRANTS. IN AWARDING GRANTS, THE STATE
26	BOARD MAY ESTABLISH BY RULE ADDITIONAL SELECTION CRITERIA BUT
27	SHALL GIVE PREFERENCE TO AN APPLICANT THAT:

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1	(1) IS A SMALL RURAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, OR
2	(II) IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE MONEY UNDER TITLE I, PART A OF THE

10	PROGRAM, EACH LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDER THAT RECEIVES A GRANT
11	PURSUANT TO THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION TO THE

21	STATE BOARD HAS AWARDED GRANTS IN THE PRIOR FISCAL YEAR, THE
22	DEPARTMENT SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE EDUCATION AND THE
23	HEALTH AND INSURANCE COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF
