1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 22-7-303, **amend**
3 (2)(a)(I) as follows:

4 **22-7-303. Colorado state advisory council for parent**
5 **involvement in education - created - membership.** (2) The council
6 shall consist of the following members:

7 (a) The following members appointed by the state board:

8 (I) ~~Five persons~~ ONE PERSON FROM EACH CONGRESSIONAL
9 DISTRICT ~~who are parents~~ IS A PARENT OF ~~children~~ A CHILD enrolled in a
10 publicly funded preschool program, in any of grades kindergarten through
11 twelve, or in a state-supported institution of higher education. ~~who reflect~~
12 ~~student populations that are significantly represented in the state; and two~~
13 ~~of whom are~~ FOUR OF THE members APPOINTED PURSUANT TO THIS
14 SUBSECTION (2)(a)(I) MUST BE MEMBERS of a school accountability
15 committee or a school district accountability committee. IN MAKING THE
16 APPOINTMENTS PURSUANT TO THIS SUBSECTION (2)(a)(I), THE STATE
17 BOARD SHALL CONSIDER THE STUDENT POPULATIONS THAT ARE
18 SIGNIFICANTLY REPRESENTED IN THE STATE.

19 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend** 22-7-306 as
20 follows:

21 **22-7-306. Repeal of part.** (1) This part 3 is repealed, effective
22 ~~July 1, 2019~~ SEPTEMBER 1, 2024.

23 (2) Prior to said repeal, the council shall be reviewed as provided

25 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 2-3-1203, **repeal**

1 (8)(a)(IV); and **add** (15)(a)(VI) as follows:

2 **2-3-1203. Sunset review of advisory committees - legislative**
3 **declaration - definition - repeal.** (8) (a) The following statutory
4 authorizations for the designated advisory committees will repeal on July
5 1, 2019:

6 (IV) ~~The Colorado state advisory council for parent involvement~~
7 ~~in education created in section 22-7-303, C.R.S.;~~

8 (15) (a) The following statutory authorizations for the designated
9 advisory committees are scheduled for repeal on September 1, 2024:

10 (VI) ~~THE COLORADO STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL FOR PARENT~~
11 ~~INVOLVEMENT IN EDUCATION CREATED IN SECTION 22-7-303.~~

12 **SECTION 4. Appropriation.** For the 2019-20 state fiscal year,
13 \$2,000 is appropriated to the department of education. This appropriation
14 is from the general fund. To implement this act, the department may use
15 this appropriation for accountability and improvement planning.

16 **SECTION 5. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
17 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
18 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
