The House Health and Insurance Committee Report (04/24/19) removed the Hospital Community Accountability Boards and instead requires each hospital to convene meetings at least annually regarding the hospital's community benefit. This removes the costs for the Department of Health Care Policy and Financing to staff and support the Hospital Community Accountability Boards, and also removes mileage expense reimbursement costs to board members. Several state and local government entities must be invited to participate in the hospital community benefit meetings, but it is assumed any participation costs can be absorbed within existing resources.

With the strike below amendment adopted by the House Health and Insurance Committee, the bill no longer has a fiscal impact. Legislative Council Staff agrees with this assessment.
