Bill Topic: CDPHE EMERGENCY MEDICAL AND TRAUMA CARE SYSTEM

Summary of Fiscal Impact: **No fiscal impact.** This bill removes obsolete language from statute related to an emergency medical and trauma care system. It will not impact the revenue or expenditures of any state or local agency and is assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Appropriation Summary: No appropriation is required.

Fiscal Note Status: The fiscal note reflects the enacted bill.

Summary of Legislation

This bill repeals obsolete statutory language related to the deadline for the creation of the statewide emergency medical and trauma care system by the State Board of Health. It also removes the requirement for the board to cooperate with the Department of Personnel and Administration in adopting criteria related to communication systems referenced by counties in regional emergency medical and trauma system plans.

Assessment of No Fiscal Impact

The bill removes a paragraph of statute that is obsolete. It will not impact the revenue or expenditures of any state or local government and is therefore assessed as having no fiscal impact.

Effective Date

The bill was signed into law by the Governor on March 18, 2019, and takes effect August 2, 2019, assuming no referendum petition is filed.
