AN ACT

CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE POLICY AND FINANCING.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:

SECTION 1. Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018. In Session Laws of Colorado 2018, section 2 of chapter 424, (HB 18-1322), amend Part V as follows:

- 10a Department of Health Care Policy and Financing, Executive Director's Office, General Administration, General Professional Services and Special Projects -- Of this appropriation, \$1,372,076 remains available for expenditure on the single assessment tool project through the completion of the project or the close of the 2019-20 state fiscal year, whichever comes first.

- **SECTION 3.** Appropriation to the department of health care policy and financing for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017. (1) For the 2017-18 state fiscal year, \$26,943,875 is appropriated to the department of health care policy and financing and is for the payment of overexpenditures of line item appropriations contained in Part V of section 2 of chapter 421 (SB 17-254), Session Laws of Colorado 2017, as follows:
 - (a) \$17,847,003 from the general fund for medical services premiums;
 - (b) \$444,003 from the general fund for behavioral health capitation payments;
- (c) \$1,265,019 for the children's basic health plan medical and dental costs, which consists of \$523,427 from the children's basic health plan trust fund created in section 25.5-8-105 (1), C.R.S., and \$741,592 from recoveries and recoupments; and
- (d) \$7,387,850 for mental health institutes, which consists of \$3,694,541 from the general fund and \$3,693,309 from federal funds.
