legislative oversight committee concerning the treatment of persons with mental health disorders in the criminal and juvenile justice systems (committee), and the associated task force (task force), to July 1, 2023. Substantive changes included in the reauthorization include broadening the name and scope of the committee and task force from "persons with mental health disorders" to "persons with behavioral health disorders"; making collaboration mandatory between members of the committee and the task force; allowing the task force to research topics for members of the committee upon request; adjusting task force membership; further defining issues for the task force to study; and providing staff support by the legislative council staff.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-1.9-103, **add**
3 **(2)(d)** as follows:

4 **18-1.9-103. Legislative oversight committee concerning the**
5 **treatment of persons with mental health disorders in the criminal and**
6 **juvenile justice systems - creation - duties. (2) Duties.**

7 **(d) NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SUBSECTION (2), THE**
8 **COMMITTEE SHALL NOT MEET OR RECOMMEND LEGISLATION DURING THE**
9 **2020 INTERIM, OR DURING ANY INTERIM IN WHICH THE GENERAL**
10 **ASSEMBLY HAS SUSPENDED INTERIM COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES, AND IS NOT**
11 **REQUIRED TO SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON**
12 **OR BEFORE JANUARY 15, 2021, OR ANY JANUARY FOLLOWING THE**
13 **SUSPENSION OF INTERIM COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES BY THE GENERAL**
14 **ASSEMBLY.**

15 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 18-1.9-104, **add (7)**
16 **as follows:**

17 **18-1.9-104. Task force concerning the treatment of persons**
18 **with mental health disorders in the criminal and juvenile justice**
19 **systems - creation - membership - duties. (7) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY**

1 PROVISION OF THIS SECTION, THE TASK FORCE IS NOT REQUIRED TO MEET,
2 SUBMIT ANNUAL POLICY AND LEGISLATIVE RECOMMENDATIONS, OR
3 SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE COMMITTEE DURING THE 2020
4 INTERIM OR DURING ANY INTERIM IN WHICH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY HAS
5 SUSPENDED INTERIM COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES.

6 **SECTION 3.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **amend 18-1.9-107**
7 as follows:

8 **18-1.9-107. Repeal of article.** This ~~article~~ ARTICLE 1.9 is
9 repealed, effective ~~July 1, 2020~~ JULY 1, 2023.

10 **SECTION 4. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
11 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
12 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.
