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A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING SUPPORTING THE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL  
102 WORKFORCE.

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Bill Summary

*(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill adds definitions for "peer support professional" and "recovery support services organization" for the purposes of permissible claims submitted for reimbursement under the medical services program. A recovery support services organization (recovery organization) may bill and submit for reimbursement certain eligible peer support services (support services) provided by peer support professionals. The department

of human services (department) is responsible for approving a recovery support services organization for reimbursement for support services. The bill sets forth detailed criteria for approval by the department, and the department is given rule-making authority to establish other criteria and standards as necessary.

The bill creates a refundable income tax credit available for income tax years commencing on or after January 1, 2021, but before January 1, 2031, for eligible peer support professionals (eligible individuals) who have worked in Colorado at least part-time for at least 3 years in the behavioral health sector and who either return to school or who graduate and return to work in the public or private health care sector. The tax credit is available for 4 consecutive years for eligible individuals who return to school and for 3 consecutive years for eligible individuals who return to work after attending school. The office of behavioral health in the department of human services (office) shall, in conjunction with the department of human services, review documentation supplied by eligible individuals seeking the tax credit and provide certification to the department of revenue if eligibility criteria for the tax credit is met. The office may not issue tax credit certificates that total more than \$100,000 per income tax year.

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1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 27-60-108 as  
3 follows:

4 **27-60-108. Reimbursement for eligible peer support services**  
5 **- requirements - rules - definitions.** (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION,  
6 UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES:

7 (a) "MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM" MEANS THE PROGRAM  
8 ESTABLISHED IN ARTICLES 4, 5, AND 6 OF TITLE 25.5.

9 (b) "PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL" MEANS A PEER SUPPORT  
10 SPECIALIST, RECOVERY COACH, PEER AND FAMILY RECOVERY SUPPORT  
11 SPECIALIST, PEER MENTOR, FAMILY ADVOCATE, OR FAMILY SYSTEMS  
12 NAVIGATOR. A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL IS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE  
13 OR OLDER AND SELF-IDENTIFIES AS HAVING EXPERIENCED THE PROCESS OF  
14 RECOVERY FROM A MENTAL HEALTH DISORDER, SUBSTANCE USE

1 DISORDER, TRAUMA, OR ONE OR ALL OF SUCH CONDITIONS, EITHER AS A  
2 CONSUMER OF RECOVERY SERVICES OR AS THE PARENT OR A FAMILY  
3 MEMBER OF THE CONSUMER. A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL PROVIDES  
4 NONCLINICAL SUPPORT SERVICES THAT ALIGN WITH RECOMMENDATIONS  
5 FROM THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES  
6 ADMINISTRATION OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND  
7 HUMAN SERVICES. A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL ENGAGES INDIVIDUALS  
8 IN PEER-TO-PEER RELATIONSHIPS THAT SUPPORT HEALING, PERSONAL  
9 GROWTH, LIFE SKILLS DEVELOPMENT, SELF-CARE, AND CRISIS-STRATEGY  
10 DEVELOPMENT TO HELP ACHIEVE RECOVERY, WELLNESS, AND LIFE GOALS.  
11 A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL HAS FORMAL TRAINING IN ALL CONTENT  
12 AREAS OUTLINED IN THE CORE COMPETENCIES FOR PEER SUPPORT  
13 PROFESSIONALS BY THE SUBSTANCE ABUSE AND MENTAL HEALTH  
14 SERVICES ADMINISTRATION OF THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF  
15 HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

16 (c) "RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION" MEANS AN  
17 ORGANIZATION LED AND GOVERNED BY REPRESENTATIVES OF LOCAL  
18 COMMUNITIES OF RECOVERY. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE STATE  
19 DEPARTMENT SHALL APPROVE ALL RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES  
20 ORGANIZATIONS. RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDE  
21 RECOVERY-FOCUSED SERVICES AND SUPPORTS, INCLUDING:

- 22 (I) PEER-DELIVERED SUPPORT SERVICES;
- 23 (II) PEER-RUN DROP-IN CENTERS, RECOVERY AND WELLNESS  
24 CENTERS, AND EMPLOYMENT SERVICES;
- 25 (III) PREVENTION AND EARLY INTERVENTION ACTIVITIES;
- 26 (IV) PEER MENTORING FOR CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS;
- 27 (V) PATIENT AND FAMILY SUPPORT GROUPS;

1 (VI) WARM LINES; AND

2 (VII) ADVOCACY SERVICES.

3 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2022, A RECOVERY SUPPORT  
4 SERVICES ORGANIZATION, AS DEFINED IN SUBSECTION (1) OF THIS SECTION,  
5 THAT IS ENROLLED IN THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM MAY SERVE AS  
6 THE RENDERING PROVIDER FOR CLAIMS SUBMITTED FOR SERVICES  
7 PERFORMED BY A RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION BY A PEER  
8 SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL. A RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION  
9 MAY BILL FOR ELIGIBLE SERVICES, AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1)(c) OF  
10 THIS SECTION, INCLUDING THOSE ALLOWED UNDER THE DEPARTMENT OF  
11 HEALTH CARE POLICY AND FINANCING'S COMMUNITY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH  
12 SERVICES PROGRAM WAIVER.

13 (3) A RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION THAT IS  
14 ENROLLED IN THE MEDICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM MAY EMPLOY AND BE  
15 THE RENDERING PROVIDER FOR CLAIMS SUBMITTED BY PEER SUPPORT  
16 PROFESSIONALS WORKING IN VARIOUS CLINICAL AND NONCLINICAL  
17 SETTINGS, INCLUDING:

18 (a) JUSTICE-INVOLVED SETTINGS;

19 (b) PHYSICAL HEALTH SETTINGS, SUCH AS PEDIATRICIAN OR  
20 OBSTETRIC AND GYNECOLOGICAL HEALTH CARE OFFICES;

21 (c) EMERGENCY DEPARTMENTS;

22 (d) COMMUNITIES WITH PERSONS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS;

23 AND

24 (e) PEER RESPITE HOMES.

25 (4) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2021, IN APPROVING A RECOVERY  
26 SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION FOR REIMBURSEMENT PURSUANT TO  
27 THIS SECTION, THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL REQUIRE:

1 (a) THE RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION TO EMPLOY  
2 OR CONTRACT WITH A LICENSED MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDER WHO IS IN  
3 GOOD STANDING AND CAN DEMONSTRATE TRAINING IN SUPERVISING PEER  
4 SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS;

5 (b) THE RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATION TO HAVE AN  
6 ESTABLISHED PROCESS BY WHICH THE ORGANIZATION COORDINATES ITS  
7 SERVICES WITH THOSE RENDERED BY OTHER AGENCIES TO ENSURE AN  
8 UNINTERRUPTED CONTINUUM OF CARE TO PERSONS WITH BEHAVIORAL  
9 HEALTH DISORDERS; AND

10 (c) RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES ORGANIZATIONS AND PEER  
11 SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS TO MEET ANY OTHER STANDARDS AS  
12 DETERMINED BY RULE OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT.

13 (5) THE STATE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMULGATE RULES  
14 ESTABLISHING MINIMUM STANDARDS THAT RECOVERY SUPPORT SERVICES  
15 ORGANIZATIONS MUST MEET IN ADDITION TO THOSE OUTLINED IN  
16 SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION.

17 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, **add** 39-22-543 as  
18 follows:

19 **39-22-543. Peer support professional income tax credit -**  
20 **report - rules - legislative declaration - definitions - repeal.**

21 (1) (a) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES THAT:

22 (I) PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS ARE IMPORTANT PROFESSIONALS  
23 WHO HELP OTHERS ACHIEVE RECOVERY AND WELLNESS;

24 (II) THE USE OF PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS IS CONSIDERED TO  
25 REDUCE HOSPITALIZATIONS BY HALF, INCREASE ENGAGEMENT IN  
26 SELF-CARE AND WELLNESS, AND DECREASE PSYCHOTIC SYMPTOMS IN  
27 PEOPLE IN TREATMENT;

1 (III) OTHER STATES HAVE FOUND THAT USING THE SERVICES OF  
2 PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS FOR PEOPLE IN TREATMENT SAVES AN  
3 AVERAGE OF NEARLY FIVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER  
4 PERSON;

5 (IV) HOWEVER, IN THE PAST TWO YEARS, THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE  
6 IN COLORADO WHO DID NOT RECEIVE NECESSARY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH  
7 SERVICES NEARLY DOUBLED, WITH MANY AREAS OF THE STATE CITING  
8 WORKFORCE CHALLENGES AS THE LEADING CAUSE FOR UNMET NEED. PEER  
9 SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS CAN HELP FILL THAT WORKFORCE NEED.

10 (V) PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS ARE OFTEN POORLY PAID BUT  
11 WORK WITH THE MOST ACUTE AND VULNERABLE INDIVIDUALS IN  
12 TREATMENT. AN INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION FOR PEER SUPPORTERS  
13 FOUND THAT MORE THAN EIGHTY PERCENT WERE INTERESTED IN  
14 CONTINUED JOB TRAINING AND NEARLY FORTY-FIVE PERCENT SAID THEY  
15 EXPECTED TO STAY IN THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH FIELD.

16 (VI) WITHOUT CONTINUING EDUCATION, PEER SUPPORT  
17 PROFESSIONALS WILL REACH A PROFESSIONAL CEILING RESULTING IN  
18 POTENTIAL BURNOUT AND LEAVING THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SECTOR.

19 (b) THEREFORE, THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES THAT IT IS IN  
20 THE BEST INTEREST OF THE STATE TO SUPPORT THE PEER SUPPORT  
21 PROFESSIONAL WORKFORCE BY MAKING AVAILABLE AN INCOME TAX  
22 CREDIT FOR PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS WHO MEET ESTABLISHED  
23 CRITERIA.

24 (2) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE  
25 REQUIRES:

26 (a) "BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER" MEANS A  
27 PROFESSIONAL WHO PROVIDES BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE SERVICES IN

1 THE PROFESSIONAL'S SCOPE OF PRACTICE. "BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE  
2 PROVIDER" INCLUDES:

- 3 (I) A LICENSED ADDICTION COUNSELOR;
- 4 (II) A CERTIFIED ADDICTION COUNSELOR;
- 5 (III) A LICENSED PROFESSIONAL COUNSELOR;
- 6 (IV) A LICENSED CLINICAL SOCIAL WORKER;
- 7 (V) A LICENSED MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPIST; AND
- 8 (VI) A LICENSED PSYCHOLOGIST.

9 (b) "DEPARTMENT" MEANS THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE.

10 (c) "ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL" MEANS AN  
11 INDIVIDUAL WHO IS CURRENTLY EMPLOYED IN THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH  
12 SECTOR AS A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL OR WHO HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN  
13 EMPLOYED WITHIN THE PAST TWELVE MONTHS IN THE BEHAVIORAL  
14 HEALTH SECTOR AS A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL. AN ELIGIBLE PEER  
15 SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL SHALL ALSO MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA OF  
16 EITHER SUBSECTION (2)(c)(I) OR (2)(c)(II) OF THIS SECTION:

17 (I) (A) HAS BEEN EMPLOYED IN COLORADO AS A PEER SUPPORT  
18 PROFESSIONAL AT LEAST PART-TIME IN THE BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SECTOR  
19 FOR A MINIMUM OF THREE YEARS; AND

20 (B) IS MATRICULATING AT THE UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE  
21 LEVEL FROM AN ACCREDITED COLORADO INSTITUTION OF HIGHER  
22 EDUCATION WITH AT LEAST TWELVE CREDIT HOURS PER ACADEMIC YEAR;

23 OR

24 (II) (A) HAS BEEN PREVIOUSLY EMPLOYED IN COLORADO AS A  
25 PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL AT LEAST PART-TIME IN THE BEHAVIORAL  
26 HEALTH SECTOR FOR A MINIMUM OF THREE YEARS;

27 (B) HAS GRADUATED AT THE UNDERGRADUATE OR GRADUATE

1 LEVEL FROM AN ACCREDITED COLORADO INSTITUTION OF HIGHER  
2 EDUCATION; AND

3 (C) WAS SUBSEQUENTLY EMPLOYED IN COLORADO AT LEAST  
4 PART-TIME IN THE PUBLIC OR PRIVATE HEALTH CARE SECTOR AS A  
5 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE PROVIDER.

6 (d) "INFLATION" MEANS THE ANNUAL PERCENTAGE CHANGE IN THE  
7 UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR'S BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS  
8 CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR DENVER-AURORA-LAKEWOOD FOR ALL  
9 ITEMS PAID BY ALL URBAN CONSUMERS, OR ITS APPLICABLE PREDECESSOR  
10 OR SUCCESSOR INDEX.

11 (e) "PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL" MEANS A PEER SUPPORT  
12 SPECIALIST, RECOVERY COACH, PEER AND FAMILY RECOVERY SUPPORT  
13 SPECIALIST, PEER MENTOR, FAMILY ADVOCATE, OR FAMILY SYSTEMS  
14 NAVIGATOR. A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL IS EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE  
15 OR OLDER AND SELF-IDENTIFIES AS HAVING EXPERIENCED THE PROCESS OF  
16 RECOVERY FROM A MENTAL HEALTH DISORDER, SUBSTANCE USE  
17 DISORDER, TRAUMA, OR ONE OR ALL OF SUCH CONDITIONS, EITHER AS A

27 A PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL HAS FORMAL TRAINING IN ALL CONTENT

5 (f) "REVIEWING ENTITY" MEANS THE OFFICE OF BEHAVIORAL  
6 HEALTH IN THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.

7 (3) (a) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3)(b) OF THIS  
8 SECTION, FOR INCOME TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER JANUARY  
9 1, 2021, BUT BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2031, AN ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT  
10 PROFESSIONAL IS ALLOWED A CREDIT AGAINST THE TAX IMPOSED BY THIS  
11 ARTICLE 22 IN AN AMOUNT OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS.

12 (b) (I) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3)(b)(II) OF THIS  
13 SECTION, AN ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL MAY APPLY TO THE  
14 REVIEWING ENTITY FOR A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE. THE APPLYING PEER  
15 SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL SHALL PROVIDE ANY DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED  
16 BY THE REVIEWING ENTITY TO VERIFY THAT HE OR SHE MEETS THE  
17 ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. THE REVIEWING ENTITY  
18 SHALL REVIEW THE DOCUMENTATION PROVIDED AND, IF APPROPRIATE,  
19 SHALL ISSUE THE ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL WITH A TAX  
20 CREDIT CERTIFICATE; EXCEPT THAT THE REVIEWING ENTITY SHALL NOT  
21 ISSUE MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS IN TOTAL TAX  
22 CREDIT CERTIFICATES IN AN INCOME TAX YEAR. TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATES  
23 SHALL BE ISSUED IN THE ORDER IN WHICH THEY ARE REQUESTED.

24 (II) AN ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL WHO MEETS THE  
25 CRITERIA SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (2)(c)(I) OF THIS SECTION MAY SEEK  
26 A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE FOR NO MORE THAN FOUR CONSECUTIVE  
27 YEARS. AN ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL WHO MEETS THE

1 CRITERIA SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (2)(c)(II) OF THIS SECTION MAY SEEK  
2 A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE FOR NO MORE THAN THREE CONSECUTIVE  
3 YEARS.

4 (c) TO CLAIM THE CREDIT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION, THE  
5 ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL SHALL INCLUDE THE CREDIT  
6 CERTIFICATE WITH THE INCOME TAX RETURN FILED WITH THE  
7 DEPARTMENT.

8 (d) FOR THE INCOME TAX YEARS COMMENCING ON OR AFTER  
9 JANUARY 1, 2022, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADJUST THE CREDIT AMOUNT  
10 SET FORTH IN SUBSECTION (3)(a) OF THIS SECTION TO REFLECT INFLATION  
11 FOR EACH INCOME TAX YEAR IN WHICH THE CREDIT DESCRIBED IN THIS  
12 SECTION IS ALLOWED.

13 (e) AN ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL IS ALLOWED ONE  
14 CREDIT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION PER YEAR.

15 (4) THE AMOUNT OF THE CREDIT ALLOWED PURSUANT TO THIS  
16 SECTION THAT EXCEEDS THE ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL'S  
17 INCOME TAXES DUE IS REFUNDED TO THE ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT  
18 PROFESSIONAL.

19 (5) THE REVIEWING ENTITY SHALL TRACK ALL THE CREDIT  
20 CERTIFICATES ISSUED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IN EACH INCOME TAX  
21 YEAR IN ORDER TO DETERMINE:

22 (a) HOW MANY CREDIT CERTIFICATES HAVE BEEN ISSUED TO EACH  
23 ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL SO THAT THE MAXIMUM NUMBER  
24 OF CREDITS ISSUED PER PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL SET FORTH IN  
25 SUBSECTION (3)(b)(II) OF THIS SECTION ARE NOT EXCEEDED; AND

26 (b) WHEN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF CREDIT CERTIFICATES ISSUED  
27 EQUALS ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS PER INCOME TAX YEAR.

1           (6) THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, WITH INPUT FROM THE  
2 REVIEWING ENTITY, SHALL PROMULGATE RULES CONCERNING THE  
3 DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (3) OF THIS SECTION AND ANY  
4 OTHER ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION  
5 OF THIS SECTION.

6           (7) THE REVIEWING ENTITY SHALL PROVIDE AN ANNUAL REPORT  
7 TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT SPECIFIES THE NAME AND SOCIAL SECURITY  
8 NUMBER OF EACH ELIGIBLE PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL WHO WAS ISSUED  
9 A TAX CREDIT CERTIFICATE AS SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (3)(b) OF THIS  
10 SECTION.

11           (8) ON OR BEFORE JULY 1, 2030, THE REVIEWING ENTITY, IN  
12 CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, SHALL  
13 SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMITTEE OF  
14 THE SENATE AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH CARE AND HUMAN SERVICES  
15 COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, OR ANY SUCCESSOR  
16 COMMITTEES. THE REPORT MUST PROVIDE AN OVERVIEW OF THE NUMBER  
17 AND TYPES OF PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS WHO WERE ISSUED A TAX  
18 CREDIT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION AND MUST INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING  
19 INFORMATION:

- 20           (a) TOTAL NUMBER OF TAX CREDITS ISSUED PER YEAR;
- 21           (b) TYPES OF STUDY AREAS PURSUED;
- 22           (c) AVERAGE NUMBER OF TAX CREDITS CLAIMED PER INDIVIDUAL;
- 23           (d) COMMON ISSUES OR BARRIERS ENCOUNTERED IN PROVIDING  
24 DOCUMENTATION FOR A TAX CREDIT; AND
- 25           (e) ANY INFORMATION OR RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE THE  
26 TAX CREDIT PROGRAM FOR PEER SUPPORT PROFESSIONALS.

27           (9) THIS SECTION IS REPEALED, EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 2034.

1           **SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date.** This act  
2 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the  
3 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August  
4 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a  
5 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the  
6 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act  
7 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect  
8 unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in  
9 November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the  
10 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.
