A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR INFERTILITY.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at <u>http://leg.colorado.gov</u>.)

The bill enacts the "Colorado Building Families Act", which requires health benefit plans issued or renewed in Colorado on or after January 1, 2022, to cover diagnosis of infertility, treatment for infertility, and fertility preservation services. The coverage for fertility medications must not impose any limits that are not applicable to coverage under the plan for other prescription medications, and the plan cannot impose deductibles, copayments, coinsurance, benefit maximums, waiting periods, or other limitations that are not applicable to other medical services covered under the plan.

The short title of this act is the 3 "Colorado Building Families Act". 4 **SECTION 2.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 10-16-104, add (23) 5 as follows: 6 10-16-104. Mandatory coverage provisions - definitions -7 rules. (23) Infertility diagnosis and treatment - fertility preservation 8 services. (a) ALL INDIVIDUAL AND GROUP HEALTH BENEFIT PLANS ISSUED 9 OR RENEWED IN THIS STATE SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR THE 10 DIAGNOSIS OF AND TREATMENT FOR INFERTILITY AND STANDARD 11 FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES. 12 (b) THE COVERAGE REQUIRED BY THIS SUBSECTION (23) INCLUDES 13 FOUR COMPLETED OOCYTE RETRIEVALS WITH UNLIMITED EMBRYO 14 TRANSFERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE GUIDELINES OF THE ASRM, USING 15 SINGLE EMBRYO TRANSFER WHEN RECOMMENDED AND MEDICALLY 16 APPROPRIATE. 17 (c) THE HEALTH BENEFIT PLAN SHALL NOT IMPOSE: 18 (I) ANY EXCLUSIONS, LIMITATIONS, OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS ON 19 COVERAGE OF FERTILITY MEDICATIONS THAT ARE DIFFERENT FROM THE 20 EXCLUSIONS, LIMITATIONS, OR OTHER RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON ANY 21 OTHER PRESCRIPTION MEDICATIONS COVERED UNDER THE HEALTH BENEFIT 22 PLAN; OR 23 (II)DEDUCTIBLES, COPAYMENTS, COINSURANCE, BENEFIT 24 MAXIMUMS, WAITING PERIODS, OR OTHER LIMITATIONS ON COVERAGE FOR

9 (I) "ACOG" MEANS THE AMERICAN COLLEGE OF OBSTETRICIANS
10 AND GYNECOLOGISTS OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION.

11 (II) "ASCO" MEANS THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF CLINICAL
12 ONCOLOGY OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION.

13 (III) "ASRM" MEANS THE AMERICAN SOCIETY FOR
14 REPRODUCTIVE MEDICINE OR ITS SUCCESSOR ORGANIZATION.

(IV) "DIAGNOSIS OF AND TREATMENT FOR INFERTILITY" MEANS
THE PROCEDURES AND MEDICATIONS RECOMMENDED BY A LICENSED
PHYSICIAN THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH ESTABLISHED, PUBLISHED, OR
APPROVED MEDICAL PRACTICES OR PROFESSIONAL GUIDELINES FROM
ACOG OR ASRM FOR DIAGNOSING AND TREATING INFERTILITY.

20 (V) "FAILURE TO IMPREGNATE OR CONCEIVE" MEANS THE FAILURE 21 TO ESTABLISH A CLINICAL PREGNANCY AFTER TWELVE MONTHS OF 22 REGULAR, UNPROTECTED SEXUAL INTERCOURSE OR THERAPEUTIC DONOR 23 INSEMINATION FOR A WOMAN UNDER THE AGE OF THIRTY-FIVE, OR AFTER 24 SIX MONTHS OF REGULAR, UNPROTECTED SEXUAL INTERCOURSE OR 25 THERAPEUTIC DONOR INSEMINATION FOR A WOMAN THIRTY-FIVE YEARS OF 26 AGE OR OLDER. CONCEPTION RESULTING IN A MISCARRIAGE DOES NOT 27 RESTART THE TWELVE-MONTH OR SIX-MONTH CLOCK TO QUALIFY AS

2 (VI) "INFERTILITY" MEANS A DISEASE OR CONDITION
3 CHARACTERIZED BY:

(A) THE FAILURE TO IMPREGNATE OR CONCEIVE;

5 (B) A PERSON'S INABILITY TO REPRODUCE EITHER AS AN
6 INDIVIDUAL OR WITH THE PERSON'S PARTNER; OR

7 (C) A LICENSED PHYSICIAN'S FINDINGS BASED ON A PATIENT'S
8 MEDICAL, SEXUAL, AND REPRODUCTIVE HISTORY, AGE, PHYSICAL
9 FINDINGS, OR DIAGNOSTIC TESTING.

10 (VII) "LICENSED PHYSICIAN" MEANS A PERSON LICENSED BY THE
11 COLORADO MEDICAL BOARD PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 240 OF TITLE 12 TO
12 PRACTICE MEDICINE IN THIS STATE.

(VIII) "STANDARD FERTILITY PRESERVATION SERVICES" MEANS
PROCEDURES AND SERVICES THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH ESTABLISHED
MEDICAL PRACTICES OR PROFESSIONAL GUIDELINES PUBLISHED BY ASRM
OR ASCO FOR A PERSON WHO HAS A MEDICAL CONDITION OR IS EXPECTED
TO UNDERGO MEDICATION THERAPY, SURGERY, RADIATION,
CHEMOTHERAPY, OR OTHER MEDICAL TREATMENT THAT IS RECOGNIZED BY
MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS TO CAUSE A RISK OF IMPAIRMENT TO FERTILITY.

20 SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date -21 **applicability.** (1) This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following 22 the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the 23 general assembly (August 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 24 2020); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 25 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, 26 or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part 27 will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election
