A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING REQUIREMENTS FOR REGISTERED APPRENTICES.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill requires electrician apprentices and plumbing apprentices who have been registered with their respective boards for at least 6 years to take a license examination on a periodic basis until the apprentice passes the examination.

The bill requires an employer, an apprenticeship program registered with the United States department of labor's employment and training administration, and a state apprenticeship council recognized by the United States department of labor that employs an apprentice in

Colorado to track the number of practical training hours and, for electrician apprentices, the classroom hours of each apprentice and provide the information to the state electrical board or the state plumbing board, as applicable. The boards must provide the reported information to the department of regulatory agencies' online apprenticeship directory.

20	EACH YEAR THEREAFTER, A REGISTERED PLUMBING CONTRACTOR, AN
21	APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM REGISTERED WITH THE UNITED STATES
22	DEPARTMENT OF LABOR'S EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING ADMINISTRATION
23	AND A STATE APPRENTICESHIP COUNCIL RECOGNIZED BY THE UNITED
24	STATES DEPARTMENT OF LABOR THAT EMPLOYS A PLUMBING APPRENTICE
25	IN THIS STATE SHALL REPORT TO THE BOARD THE CUMULATIVE NUMBER OF

22	EXAMINATION AS REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (4) OF THIS SECTION, THE
23	BOARD MAY SUSPEND THE PLUMBING APPRENTICE'S REGISTRATION UNTIL
24	THE REQUIREMENTS ARE MET.
25	SECTION 3. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act
26	takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the
27	ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August

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- 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the
- 7 official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
