A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 CONCERNING A STATEWIDE NEEDS ASSESSMENT OF SERVICES
102 PROVIDED BY VETERANS COMMUNITY LIVING CENTERS.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill requires the state department of human services (department) to conduct a statewide needs assessment of the services provided by veterans community living centers, including changes to services necessitated by changing demographics of the veteran population, the advantages and limitations of providing services through existing veterans community living centers, and alternative models of

care for providing services to veterans.

The department is required to submit the final assessment to the state, veterans, and military affairs committees of the house of representatives and the senate on or before December 1, 2020. The department may enter into an agreement with a third party to conduct the assessment.

1	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:
2	SECTION 1. In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 26-12-111.5 as
3	follows:
4	26-12-111.5. Veterans community living centers statewide
5	needs assessment - report - repeal. (1) (a) THE STATE DEPARTMENT
6	SHALL CONDUCT A STATEWIDE NEEDS ASSESSMENT, REFERRED TO IN THIS
7	SECTION AS THE "ASSESSMENT", OF THE SERVICES PROVIDED BY VETERANS
8	COMMUNITY LIVING CENTERS.
9	(b) The state department may enter into an agreement
10	WITH A THIRD PARTY TO CONDUCT THE ASSESSMENT DESCRIBED IN THIS
11	SUBSECTION (1). THE THIRD PARTY MUST NOT HAVE A FINANCIAL
12	INTEREST IN PROVIDING SERVICES TO VETERANS. THE THIRD PARTY MUST
13	HAVE EXPERIENCE PERFORMING PUBLIC POLICY ANALYSIS, LONG-TERM
14	POPULATION FORECASTING, AND HEALTH CARE AND LONG-TERM CARE
15	NEEDS ASSESSMENTS AND MARKET STUDIES.
16	(c) THE STATE DEPARTMENT OR THIRD PARTY SHALL CONSULT
17	WITH INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN COLORADO THAT MAY HAVE
18	RESOURCES TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE ASSESSMENT. SUCH RESOURCES MAY
19	INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, FAMILIARITY WITH LOCAL AREA
20	CONDITIONS AND CONDUCTING SPECIFIC RESEARCH THAT MAY
21	CONTRIBUTE TO THE ASSESSMENT.

(2) (a) THE ASSESSMENT MUST EVALUATE:

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(I) THE CHANGING DEMOGRAPHICS OF THE VETERAN POPULATION
IN COLORADO;
(II) THE NEEDS OF YOUNGER VETERANS, INCLUDING SERVICES AND
TREATMENT RELATED TO CHALLENGES NOT FACED BY OLDER
GENERATIONS OF VETERANS;
(III) BEST PRACTICES FOR PROVIDING SERVICES AND TREATMENT
TO VETERANS RELATED TO POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER AND
OTHER BEHAVIORAL HEALTH ISSUES;
(IV) THE ADVANTAGES AND LIMITATIONS OF PROVIDING SERVICES
THROUGH EXISTING VETERANS CENTERS;
(V) ALTERNATIVE MODELS OF CARE THAT WILL INCREASE THE
EFFICIENCY AND EFFICACY OF PROVIDING SERVICES TO VETERANS; AND
(VI) THE IMPACT OF THE CHANGING HEALTH CARE NEEDS OF
VETERANS ON LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES.
(b) THE ASSESSMENT MUST EVALUATE THE NEEDS OF VETERANS IN
ALL AREAS OF THE STATE, BUT SHOULD SPECIFICALLY EXAMINE AREAS
WITH A HIGH CONCENTRATION OF VETERANS, INCLUDING EL PASO COUNTY
AND THE SURROUNDING AREA.
(3) On or before December 1, 2020, the state department
SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT OF THE RESULTS OF THE ASSESSMENT TO THE
STATE, VETERANS, AND MILITARY AFFAIRS COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE OF
REPRESENTATIVES AND THE SENATE, OR ANY SUCCESSOR COMMITTEES.
(4) The state department shall use money from the
CENTRAL FUND TO CONDUCT THE ASSESSMENT.
(5) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2021.
SECTION 2. In Colorado Revised Statutes, 26-12-108, add
(1)(b)(I.7) as follows:

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1	26-12-108. Payments for care - funds - report - collections for
2	charges - central fund for veterans centers created - repeal.
3	(1) (b) (I.7) (A) FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR 2020-21, THE STATE
4	DEPARTMENT MAY USE MONEY CONTINUOUSLY APPROPRIATED PURSUANT
5	TO SUBSECTION $(1)(b)(I.5)$ OF THIS SECTION TO PERFORM THE ASSESSMENT
6	OF SERVICES PROVIDED BY VETERANS COMMUNITY LIVING CENTERS
7	REQUIRED PURSUANT TO SECTION 26-12-111.5.
8	(B) This subsection $(1)(b)(I.7)$ is repealed, effective June 30,
9	2021.
10	SECTION 3. Safety clause. The general assembly hereby finds,
11	determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
12	preservation of the public peace, health, or safety.

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
