A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING ESTABLISHING A MOBILE VETERAN SUPPORT UNIT GRANT

PROGRAM.

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Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. The bill establishes the mobile veteran support unit grant program (grant program) to provide one-time grants to nonprofit organizations to establish mobile veteran support units. A mobile veteran support unit acts as an initial point of contact for veterans to obtain health and well-being services, including mental health services, dental health services, telehealth services, military benefit assistance, and housing assistance.

The department of public health and environment (department) administers the grant program. The department must consult with the Colorado board of veterans affairs when adopting grant program rules.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:* 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, add 25-1-130 as 3 follows: 4 25-1-130. Mobile veteran support unit grant program - report 5 - rules - definitions - repeal. (1) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, UNLESS THE 6 CONTEXT OTHERWISE REQUIRES: 7 (a) "Grant Program" means the mobile veteran support 8 UNIT GRANT PROGRAM CREATED IN SUBSECTION (2) OF THIS SECTION. 9 (b) "VETERAN" MEANS A PERSON WHO SERVED IN THE ACTIVE 10 MILITARY, NAVAL, OR AIR SERVICE OF THE UNITED STATES, REGARDLESS 11 OF THE PERSON'S DISCHARGE STATUS. 12 (2) (a) THERE IS CREATED IN THE DEPARTMENT THE MOBILE 13 VETERAN SUPPORT UNIT GRANT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE ONE-TIME GRANTS 14 TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO ESTABLISH MOBILE VETERAN SUPPORT 15 UNITS THAT ENSURE THE HEALTH AND WELL-BEING OF VETERANS OF THE 16 UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES WHO LIVE IN RURAL COLORADO OR WHO 17 ARE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS. 18 (b) A MOBILE VETERAN SUPPORT UNIT ESTABLISHED WITH THE 19 ASSISTANCE OF A GRANT AWARD SHOULD SEEK TO BUILD TRUST WITH THE 20 VETERANS IT SERVES AND MUST ACT AS AN INITIAL POINT OF CONTACT FOR 21 VETERANS TO OBTAIN HEALTH AND WELL-BEING SERVICES. SUCH SERVICES 22 MAY INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO: 23 (I) MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES; 24 (II) DENTAL HEALTH SERVICES;

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1	(III) HEALTH CARE SERVICES DELIVERED THROUGH TELEHEALTH,
2	(IV) MILITARY BENEFIT ASSISTANCE; AND
3	(V) HOUSING ASSISTANCE.
4	(c) IN ORDER TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR A GRANT, A NONPROFIT
5	ORGANIZATION MUST HAVE EXPERIENCE PROVIDING ASSISTANCE TO
6	VETERANS, INCLUDING VETERANS EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS, AND
7	MUST DEMONSTRATE TO THE DEPARTMENT THAT THE ORGANIZATION IS
8	AWARE OF THE CHALLENGES ASSOCIATED WITH PROVIDING HEALTH
9	SERVICES IN RURAL AREAS.
10	(3) (a) The department shall administer the grant
11	PROGRAM. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ACCEPT AND REVIEW GRANT
12	APPLICATIONS AND, ON OR BEFORE MARCH 31, 2021, SELECT GRANT
13	RECIPIENTS AND AWARD ONE-TIME GRANTS TO SELECTED APPLICANTS.
14	(b) The department, in consultation with the Colorado
15	BOARD OF VETERANS AFFAIRS CREATED IN SECTION 28-5-702, SHALL
16	PROMULGATE RULES FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE GRANT PROGRAM,
17	INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO:
18	(I) PROCEDURES BY WHICH ELIGIBLE NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS
19	MAY APPLY FOR AND RECEIVE GRANTS FROM THE GRANT PROGRAM,
20	INCLUDING APPLICATION DEADLINES; AND
21	(II) PROCEDURES FOR GRANT RECIPIENTS TO REPORT TO THE
22	DEPARTMENT INFORMATION CONCERNING THE USE OF A GRANT AWARD.
23	(c) THE DEPARTMENT MAY SEEK, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND GIFTS,
24	GRANTS, OR DONATIONS FROM PRIVATE OR PUBLIC SOURCES FOR THE
25	PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION.
26	(4) A RECIPIENT OF A ONE-TIME GRANT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION
27	IS NOT DISQUALIFIED FROM RECEIVING A GRANT PURSUANT TO THE

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VETERANS ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM CREATED IN SECTION 28-5-712.
(5) In its annual report before the house and senate
COMMITTEES OF REFERENCE PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-7-203, THE
DEPARTMENT SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION DESCRIBING THE GRANTS
AWARDED THROUGH THE GRANT PROGRAM DURING THE PRECEDING YEAR.
(6) This section is repealed, effective June 30, 2022.

SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless approved by the people at the general election to be held in November 2020 and, in such case, will take effect on the date of the official declaration of the vote thereon by the governor.

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
