3	of Colorado 2019, add a new appropriation as section 3 to chapter 162,
4	(HB 19-1196), as follows:
5	Section 3. Appropriation. For the 2019-20 state fiscal year,
6	\$212,804 is appropriated to the department of higher education for use by
