## A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING A SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION TO THE DEPARTMENT

102 OF PUBLIC SAFETY.

## **Bill Summary**

Department of Public Safety, Division of Criminal Justice, Community Corrections, Community Corrections Placements -- This appropriation assumes the daily rates and average daily caseloads listed in the following table and is based on the following assumptions: the base rate for standard nonresidential services is a weighted average of the rates for four different levels of service; community corrections providers will collect client fees of up to \$17 per day for residential placements and up to \$3 per day for nonresidential placements; client fees may be partially or fully waived in specialized residential and non-residential programs with the approval of the Division of Criminal Justice; pursuant to its authority to administer and execute contracts under Section 17-27-108, C.R.S., the Division of Criminal Justice will ensure that every reasonable effort is made to achieve such collections; and outpatient therapeutic community programs: (1) will receive the standard non-residential base rate for all offenders in their programs, including Department of Corrections clients; (2) will receive the outpatient therapeutic community base rate for all clients in program phases other than the post graduate phase, including Department of Corrections clients; (3) will not receive the outpatient therapeutic community base rate or the non-residential base rate for probation clients; (4) will collect client fees of up to \$3 per day; and (5) will not receive payment from the Department of Corrections for services covered by the standard non-residential base rate or the outpatient therapeutic community base rate. Of this appropriation, \$1,545,409 is from the savings produced by H.B. 10-1360 pursuant to Section
