A BILL FOR AN ACT

CONCERNING A PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF <u>CERTAIN</u> EXOTIC ANIMALS

102 IN A TRAVELING ANIMAL ACT.

Bill Summary

(Note: This summary applies to this bill as introduced and does not reflect any amendments that may be subsequently adopted. If this bill passes third reading in the house of introduction, a bill summary that applies to the reengrossed version of this bill will be available at http://leg.colorado.gov.)

The bill creates the "Traveling Exotic Animal Safety Protection Act" (Act), which prohibits the use of exotic animals in a traveling animal act. A person who violates the Act commits a misdemeanor and is subject to a fine of between \$250 and \$1,000 per violation.

6	"TRAVELING EXOTIC ANIMAL SAFETY PROTECTION ACT".

19	(c) WILD CANIDAE OTHER THAN DOMESTIC DOGS;
20	(d) Marsupialia;
21	(e) NONHUMAN PRIMATES;
22	(f) Perissodactyla other than horses, donkeys, and mules;
23	(g) PINNIPEDIA;
24	(h) Proboscidea;
25	(i) RATITES;
26	(j) SPHENISCIDAE; AND
27	(k) Ursidae.

7	OR THE GLOBAL FEDERATION OF ANIMAL SANCTUARIES, OR ANY

9	(b) If the animal is livestock, as defined in section

12	(c) AS PART OF AN ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM IF:
13	(I) The animal is not used more than six months in a
14	CALENDAR YEAR; AND
15	(II) THE ANIMAL IS NOT KEPT IN A VEHICLE FOR MORE THAN
16	TWELVE HOURS A DAY, WHEN THE VEHICLE IS USED TO TRANSPORT OR
17	HOUSE THE ANIMAL WHILE TRAVELING TO, FROM, OR BETWEEN LOCATIONS
18	FOR PERFORMANCE PURPOSES; OR
19	(d) By a university, college, laboratory, or other
20	RESEARCH FACILITY PROPERLY LICENSED OR REGISTERED UNDER THE
21	FEDERAL "ANIMAL WELFARE ACT OF 1970", 7 U.S.C. SEC. 2131 ET SEQ.,
22	AS AMENDED, FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONDUCTING RESEARCH.
23	(5) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A
24	MISDEMEANOR AND SHALL BE PUNISHED UPON CONVICTION BY A FINE OF
25	NOT LESS THAN TWO HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS AND NOT MORE THAN ONE
26	THOUSAND DOLLARS PER VIOLATION.
7	SECTION 2 Act subject to netition - effective date -

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1	applicability. (1) This act takes effect July 1, 2021; except that, if a
2	referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the
3	state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act
4	within the ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general
5	assembly, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect unless
6	approved by the people at the general election to be held in November
7	2020 and, in such case, will take effect July 1, 2021.
8	(2) This act applies to offenses committed on or after the
9	applicable effective date of this act.

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
