The bill authorizes the department of higher education (department) to collect the data necessary to calculate return on investment metrics similar to the student cost and employment outcome information for certain higher education institutions not currently covered in the department's annual return on investment report. 1 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado: 2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-1-135, add (4.5) 3 as follows: 4 23-1-135. Department directive - undergraduate degree and 5 certificate programs - annual return on investment report - definition 6 - repeal. (4.5) THE DEPARTMENT MAY COLLECT THE DATA NECESSARY TO 7 CALCULATE RETURN ON INVESTMENT METRICS SIMILAR TO THE 8 INFORMATION DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (3)(b) OF THIS SECTION FROM A 9 PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 23-64-103 (20), 10 APPROVED BY THE PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL BOARD; OR AN 11 OUT-OF-STATE PUBLIC INSTITUTION, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 23-2-102(9), 12 PRIVATE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 23-2-102(11), 13 PRIVATE NONPROFIT COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 14 23-2-102 (12), PRIVATE OCCUPATIONAL SCHOOL, AS DEFINED BY SECTION 15 23-2-102 (13), OR SEMINARY OR RELIGIOUS TRAINING INSTITUTION, AS 16 DEFINED BY SECTION 23-2-102 (14), AUTHORIZED BY THE COMMISSION. 17 THE DEPARTMENT MAY INCLUDE THE COLLECTED INFORMATION IN THE 18 RETURN ON INVESTMENT REPORT. 19 SECTION 2. Act subject to petition - effective date. This act 20 takes effect at 12:01 a.m. on the day following the expiration of the 21 ninety-day period after final adjournment of the general assembly (August 22 5, 2020, if adjournment sine die is on May 6, 2020); except that, if a 23 referendum petition is filed pursuant to section 1 (3) of article V of the 24 state constitution against this act or an item, section, or part of this act 25 within such period, then the act, item, section, or part will not take effect
